AN ACT to amend the education law, in relation to the New York state masters-in-education teacher incentive scholarship program

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

1 Section 1. Subdivision 1 of section 669-f of the education law, as
2 added by section 1 of subpart A of part EE of chapter 56 of the laws of
3 2015, is amended to read as follows:

4 1. Eligibility. Students who are matriculated in an approved master's
5 degree in education program at a New York state [~~public institution of~~
6 ~~higher education~~] non-profit degree-granting college, as defined by
7 section two of this chapter, leading to a career as a teacher in public
8 or non-public elementary or secondary education shall be eligible for an
9 award under this section, provided the applicant: (a) earned an under-
10 graduate degree from a college located in New York state; (b) was a New
11 York state resident while earning such undergraduate degree; (c)
12 achieved academic excellence as an undergraduate student, as defined by
13 the corporation in regulation; (d) enrolls in full-time study in an
14 approved master's degree in education program at a New York state
15 [~~public institution of higher education~~] non-profit degree-granting
16 college, as defined by section two of this chapter, leading to a career
17 as a teacher in public or non-public elementary or secondary education;
18 (e) signs a contract with the corporation agreeing to teach in a class-
19 room setting on a full-time basis for five years in a school located
20 within New York state providing public or non-public elementary or
21 secondary education recognized by the board of regents or the university
