AN ACT to amend the environmental conservation law, in relation to the maintenance of unimproved roads

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

1 Section 1. Article 54 of the environmental conservation law is amended 2 by adding a new title 14 to read as follows:

UNIMPROVED ROAD MAINTENANCE

12 § 54-1401. Statement of purpose.

It is the intent and purpose of this title:

14 1. to fund safe, efficient and environmentally sound maintenance of

15 sections of unimproved roads which have been identified as sources of

16 sediment pollution; and

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17 2. to establish a dedicated and earmarked funding mechanism that

18 provides streamlined appropriation to the county level and enables local

19 officials to establish fiscal and environmental controls.

- Subject to annual appropriation by the legislature to the department, funding shall be made available by the department for the maintenance and improvement of unimproved roads and/or the maintenance and mitigation of sediment pollution from unimproved roads. The department shall apportion the funds based on written criteria it develops to establish priorities based on preventing and mitigating sediment pollution.
- 7 § 54-1405. Apportionment criteria.
 - The apportionment criteria shall:
- 9 <u>1. be based on verified need to correct pollution problems related to</u>
 10 <u>the road;</u>
- 2. consider the total miles of unimproved roads maintained by local municipalities or state agencies that are open to the public during any period of the year;
- 14 <u>3. consider total miles of unimproved roads within critical</u>
 15 watersheds; and
- 4. consider the commitments of grant applicants to comply with the nonpollution requirements established.
- 18 § 54-1407. Department's responsibilities.
 - The department shall:

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- 20 <u>1. adopt performance standards;</u>
 - provide for a system of audit;
- 3. annually assess the program and annually report to the transportation committee and environmental conservation committees of both the assembly and senate on its acceptance and effectiveness; and
- 25 <u>4. be entitled to withhold and expend the costs of the audit and</u>
 26 report preparation up to the maximum limit of two percent of the funds
 27 administered.
- 28 § 54-1409. County soil and water conservation districts.
- Apportioned funds are to be dispersed to county soil and water conservation districts which apply for them and are to be used by local municipalities that maintain roads within the county and fulfill certain requirements specified under section 54-1413 of this title.
- 33 § 54-1411. Administration.
- 34 The soil and water conservation district's administration of funding 35 shall include:
- 1. adoption of written criteria to assure equal access for all eligible applicants within specified funding categories;
- 2. provision of documentation that application has been made for all required permits;
- 40 <u>3. adoption of procedures that assure a minimal amount of procedural</u>
 41 paperwork;
 - 4. adoption of written criteria to specify priorities;
- 43 <u>5. adoption of funding categories to provide for separate budgeting</u>
 44 <u>for:</u>
- 45 (a) Municipal government roads.
 - (b) Road demonstration projects.
 - (c) Training grants restricted to fifteen percent of funding.
- 48 (d) Administrative costs, limited to actual documented costs and 49 restricted to a maximum of ten percent;
- 50 <u>6. adoption of incentives for training road managers and equipment</u>
 51 <u>operators</u>;
- 52 <u>7. adoption of standards that prohibit use of materials or practices</u>
 53 which are environmentally harmful; and
- 8. adoption of site inspection requirements to verify completion of work.
- 56 § 54-1413. Grant applications.

- Each grant application shall:
 - 1. be specific to one work location or one type of work;
- 2. expedite the approval process by allowing the county soil and water
 conservation district to insert additional requirements that complete
 and qualify the grant for approval and which when accepted by the applicant become a binding obligation on the applicant; and
- 7 3. require minimal handwritten information such as location, problem
 8 being solved, basis of cost estimate, project work schedule, basis of
 9 successful completion and type and amount of pollution reduced.
- 10 § 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
