AN ACT to amend the social services law, in relation to requiring child protective services to document home visits with photographs

## The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

1 Section 1. This act shall be known and may be cited as "Marchella 2 Pierce's Law".

3 § 2. Subdivision 3 of section 421 of the social services law, as 4 amended by chapter 718 of the laws of 1986, paragraph (a) as amended by 5 chapter 110 of the laws of 1989 and the closing paragraph as amended by 6 chapter 320 of the laws of 1990, is amended to read as follows:

7 3. promulgate regulations setting forth requirements for the perform-8 ance by local social services departments of the duties and powers 9 imposed and conferred upon them by the provisions of this title and of 10 article ten of the family court act. Such regulations shall establish 11 uniform requirements for the investigation of reports of child abuse or 12 maltreatment under this title. The department shall also issue guide-13 lines which shall set forth the circumstances or conditions under which: 14 (a) personal contact shall be made with the child named in the report 15 and any other children in the same household, including interviewing such child or children absent the subject of the report whenever possi-16 17 ble and appropriate;

(b) photographs of visible physical injuries or trauma of children who may be the victims of abuse or maltreatment shall be taken or arranged for;

(c) medical examination of a child who may be a victim of abuse or maltreatment and documentation of findings of such examination, shall be required.

The department shall promulgate regulations to establish standards for intervention, criteria for case closings, criteria for determining

whether or not to initiate a child protective proceeding, and criteria 1 2 for the formulation of treatment plans and for the delivery of child 3 protective services including specification of the services to be clas-4 sified as child protective services, which shall also apply to any soci-5 ety for the prevention of cruelty to children which has entered into a б currently valid contract with a local department of social services to 7 investigate child abuse or maltreatment reports. The department shall 8 promulgate regulations establishing minimum standards and practices for 9 the delivery of child protective services in connection with monitoring 10 and supervising respondents and their families as ordered by a family 11 court pursuant to section ten hundred thirty-nine and paragraphs (i), (iii), (iv) and (v) of subdivision (a) of section ten hundred fifty-two 12 13 the family court act. The department shall require that every caseof 14 worker, child protective services employee or any person acting pursuant 15 to a contract for services with a local social services department who 16 has contact with a child as part of a treatment plan or supervision and 17 monitoring, to document each such contact with a date and time stamped photograph of the front door of the residence where such child is domi-18 ciled during such visit or contact using a global positioning satellite 19 20 capable tablet, cellular phone or comparable device. Such photograph 21 shall be part of the confidential case record for such child and shall be subject to periodic review by the supervisor of the case. Such photo-22 23 graph must be of sufficient quality to clearly identify the front door 24 of the residence where the child is domiciled, and contain accurate data 25 with regard to the time, date and location of the photograph. The super-26 vising authority shall also require that the caseworker geographically 27 document such visit utilizing technology allowing for such geographic documentation. If the parent or legal guardian objects to the photograph 28 29 of the entrance to the residence where the child is domiciled or for the 30 geographic documentation of the visit, the caseworker shall provide a 31 form, supplied by the caseworker's agency of employment, stating that 32 the caseworker conducted the visit with the child and verified the well being of the child. Such form shall indicate which procedure or proce-33 34 dures prescribed in this section were objected to and shall be signed 35 and dated by both the child's parent or legal guardian and the casework-36 er. Such form shall be utilized at each visit where either a photograph 37 is not taken or the visit is not geographically documented. Such regu-38 lations required under this subdivision shall also require local child protective services to comply with notification requirements of the 39 40 family court act in connection with such monitoring and supervisory responsibilities. 41 42 § 3. Section 372 of the social services law is amended by adding a new 43 subdivision 4-c to read as follows: 44 4-c. The records maintained pursuant to this section by any casework-45 er, child protective services employee or authorized agency as defined

46 in section three hundred seventy-one of this title who has contact with 47 a foster child as part of a treatment plan or supervision and monitor-

48 ing, shall include documentation of each such contact in accordance with 49 the requirements set forth in subdivision three of section four hundred

- 50 twenty-one of this article.
- 51 § 4. This act shall take effect immediately.
