AN ACT to amend the environmental conservation law, in relation to the handling fee paid to a dealer or operator of a redemption center for the redemption of empty beverage containers

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Section 1. This act shall be known and may be cited as the "indexed handling fee act." § 2. Subdivision 6 of section 27-1007 of the environmental conserva-

4 tion law, as added by section 4 of part SS of chapter 59 of the laws of 5 2009, is amended to read as follows:

б 6. (a) In addition to the refund value of a beverage container as 7 established by section 27-1005 of this title, a deposit initiator shall 8 pay to any dealer or operator of a redemption center a handling fee [of 9 three and one-half cents] for each beverage container accepted by the 10 deposit initiator from such dealer or operator of a redemption center as specified in paragraphs (b), (c) and (d) of this subdivision. Payment of 11 the handling fee shall be as compensation for collecting, sorting and 12 13 packaging of empty beverage containers for transport back to the deposit 14 initiator or its designee. Payment of the handling fee may not be conditioned on the purchase of any goods or services, nor may such payment be 15 made out of the refund value account established pursuant to section 16 27-1012 of this title. A distributor who does not initiate deposits on a 17 type of beverage container is considered a dealer only for the purpose 18 19 of receiving a handling fee from a deposit initiator.

(b) Except as otherwise provided in this subdivision, the handling fee
paid shall be not less than five cents.

(c) Beginning December thirty-first, two thousand eighteen, each year
a new federal or New York state minimum wage is to take effect, but not
later than the date that the new federal or New York state minimum wage

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1	is to take effect, the commissioner shall determine the handling fee to
2	be in effect pursuant to this subdivision. Subject to paragraph (d) of
3	this subdivision, the handling fee determined pursuant to this subdivi-
4	sion shall be:
5	(i) not less than the amount in effect under paragraph (b) of this
б	subdivision on the date of such determination;
7	(ii) increased from such amount by the percentage increase in the
8	newly effective federal or New York state minimum wage; and
9	(iii) rounded to the nearest multiple of \$0.005.
10	(d) The handling fee shall only be increased by the percentage
11	increase in a newly effective federal minimum wage pursuant to paragraph
12	(c) of this subdivision if the federal minimum wage is set at an amount
13	higher than the New York state minimum wage. Otherwise, the handling fee
14	shall be increased only by the percentage increase in a newly effective
15	New York state minimum wage pursuant to paragraph (c) of this subdivi-
16	sion. If a newly effective New York state minimum wage increases based
17	on a wage rate schedule that varies throughout New York state, then the
18	percentage increase to be used for calculating the handling fee shall be
19	based on the wage rate applicable to New York city employers with eleven
20	employees or more (i.e. "big employers") pursuant to paragraph (c) of
21	this subdivision.
22	§ 3. This act shall take effect immediately.
