AN ACT to amend the highway law, in relation to designating a portion of the state highway system in Nassau county as the "Detective Steven McDonald Memorial Highway"

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Section 1. The highway law is amended by adding a new section 344-g to read as follows:

§ 344-q. Portion of the state highway system to be designated as the "Detective Steven McDonald Memorial Highway". All that portion of the highway system constituting the Southern State Parkway, beginning at the interchange of the Belt Parkway and the Cross Island Parkway, continuing in a generally easterly direction, and terminating at exit 22, the 8 intersection of the Meadowbrook State Parkway, shall be designated and known as the "Detective Steven McDonald Memorial Highway".

- § 2. The commissioner of transportation shall provide for the installation and maintenance of adequate signing of the state highway system as designated pursuant to section one of this act. However, to avoid 13 confusion and to limit any possible disruption of commerce, the desig-14 nation called for pursuant to section one of this act shall be one of 15 ceremonial nature and the official name of such highway shall not be 16 changed as a result of this act.
- 17 3. This act shall take effect on the thirtieth day after it shall 18 have become a law.
