- AN ACT to amend the public service law, in relation to making gas and electric billing information for residential rental premises available upon request

## The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Section 1. The public service law is amended by adding a new section 1 2 66-p to read as follows: 3 <u>§ 66-p. Gas and electric billing information for residential rental</u> 4 premises. Every gas corporation, electric corporation and municipality 5 shall make available to any landlord or lessor of residential rental premises, within ten days of receipt of a written request therefor from б 7 any prospective tenant or lessee thereof, prior to the commencement of 8 tenancy or execution of a lease, information consisting of the charges 9 incurred at such premises for gas or electric service or both for the 10 life of the dwelling unit or the preceding two year period, whichever is 11 shorter. Such information shall be identified solely by the address of 12 the dwelling unit, and no other information identifying the owner, lessee, or other occupant of the dwelling unit shall be utilized for, or 13 14 made available in connection with, the furnishing of billing information 15 pursuant to this section. Such information shall be furnished to both 16 the landlord or lessor and to the prospective tenant or lessee without 17 the imposition of any charge or fee therefor by any party to any party. § 2. This act shall take effect on the one hundred twentieth day after 18 19 it shall have become a law; provided that the public service commission is authorized to promulgate any and all rules and regulations and take 20 21 any other measures necessary to implement this act on its effective date 22 on or before such date.
