AN ACT to amend a chapter of the laws of 2017, amending the executive law and the general municipal law relating to requiring certain police officers to be re-trained in cardiopulmonary resuscitation every two years, as proposed in legislative bills numbers S. 3165-B and A. 2115-B, in relation to the cardiopulmonary resuscitation report requirement for the division of state police

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Section 1. Section 4 of a chapter of the laws of 2017, amending the 2 executive law and the general municipal law relating to requiring certain police officers to be re-trained in cardiopulmonary resuscitation every two years, as proposed in legislative bills numbers S. 3165-B and A. 2115-B, is amended to read as follows:

§ 4. Cardiopulmonary resuscitation report. No later than May 1, 2018 and every May first thereafter, the police department of the city of New York [and the division of state police] shall provide to the legislature a report which shall include the total number of uniformed officers 10 assigned to a patrol precinct, transit district, or police service area in the past calendar year, disaggregated by: (a) the total number 12 trained in cardiopulmonary resuscitation; (b) the total number of offi-13 cers newly trained in cardiopulmonary resuscitation in the past calendar 14 year; (c) the total number of officers re-trained in cardiopulmonary 15 resuscitation in the past calendar year.

§ 2. This act shall take effect on the same date and in the same 17 manner as a chapter of the laws of 2017, amending the executive law and 18 the general municipal law relating to requiring certain police officers 19 to be re-trained in cardiopulmonary resuscitation every two years, as 20 proposed in legislative bills numbers S. 3165-B and A. 2115-B, takes 21 effect.
