AN ACT establishing the veterans' memorials preservation act

## The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Section 1. Short title. This act shall be known and may be cited as
the "veterans' memorials preservation act".

3 § 2. Definitions. For the purposes of this act:

4 (a) a "memorial" is any park, monument, field, open land, grove of 5 trees, building, structure, artwork, tablet, plaque, wall, or any other 6 structure that has been donated to, or constructed by, a public entity 7 as a memorial to veterans of any war, conflict, or police action engaged 8 in by the armed forces of the United States, or any state of the United 9 States, or the New York national guard.

10 (b) a "public entity" is any governmental body of any kind, including, 11 but not limited to, the state, a city, town, village, borough, school 12 district or public authority.

S 3. Memorials shall be preserved and be open to the public. (a) Any public entity that has created or received a gift of a memorial shall not alter, destroy, reconfigure, adjust, change, modify or move such memorial, or cause or permit any person to commit such acts; provided, however, that such acts are permitted when reasonably necessary.

18 (b) Any public entity that has created a memorial or accepted a gift 19 of a memorial shall maintain the memorial in a reasonable manner.

20 (c) A public entity shall not restrict access to a memorial except as 21 reasonably necessary.

22 § 4. This act shall take effect immediately.
