- AN ACT to amend the education law, in relation to requiring public school districts to provide language assistance to limited English proficient parents of students

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

1	Section 1	1. Section	305 of th	e education	law is	amended	by adding	a new

57. a. All school districts shall establish a language assistance
program where limited English proficient parents would have effective
access to communicate with teachers and school personnel. This comprehensive program shall include, but is not limited to:

7 (1) Providing that all frequently used forms and other written materi-8 als that are sent home to limited English proficient parents are in 9 their primary language;

10 (2) Providing language assistance to limited English proficient 11 parents in their primary language who call or come into school with 12 concerns related to their child's schooling;

(3) Providing language assistance services to limited English proficient parents in their primary language to facilitate parent attendance at school-sponsored programs designed for communication with parents including, but not limited to, parent-teacher conferences, workshops and school fairs.

18 b. A notice of the availability of the language assistance programs 19 for limited English proficient parents established pursuant to paragraph 20 a of this subdivision shall be mailed to the homes of such limited 21 English proficient parents in a notice written in their primary

22 language.

23 <u>c. Each school district shall keep a record documenting its language</u>
24 <u>assistance program and shall submit a summary report annually to the</u>

9	d. The commissioner shall promulgate such rules and regulations as may					
10	be necessary and proper to implement the provisions of this subdivision,					
11	including but not limited to, the methodology to be used by each school					
12	district to determine or assess the primary languages, the number of					
13	limited English proficient parents, the percentage of limited English					
14	proficient parents to students and the native language of such limited					
15	English proficient parents, and a complaint procedure for any parent who					
16	alleges a school's non-compliance with the provisions of this subdivi-					
17	sion.					
18	e. For purposes of this subdivision:					
19	(1) "Primary language" means one of the five most common languages in					
20	a school district, other than English, spoken and used to communicate,					
21	by limited English proficient parents.					
22	(2) "Limited English proficient parents" means parents or parent of a					
23	minor child who attends public school and such parents or parent is					
24	unable to communicate effectively in English with teachers and school					
25	personnel at the school attended by his or her child.					
26	f. Nothing in this subdivision shall prohibit a school district from					
27	entering into a cooperative agreement with other school districts to					
28	jointly establish such a language assistance program.					
29	g. This subdivision shall only apply to school districts where non-					
30	English speaking residents or limited English proficient parents consti-					
31	tute more than five percent of the residents of such school district, as					
32	determined by data from the two most recent federal decennial censuses.					
33	§ 2. This act shall take effect on the one hundred eightieth day after					
34	it shall have become a law. Effective immediately, the addition, amend-					
35	ment and/or repeal of any rule or regulation necessary for the implemen-					
36	tation of this act on its effective date are authorized to be made and					
37	completed on or before such effective date.
