AN ACT to amend the workers' compensation law, in relation to benefits for police officers, firefighters, and other emergency personnel diagnosed with PTSD

## The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Section 1. Subdivision 3 of section 10 of the workers' compensation 2 law is amended by adding a new paragraph (c) to read as follows:

(c) Where a police officer, firefighter, emergency medical technician,

paramedic, emergency dispatcher or other person certified to provide

medical care in emergencies is diagnosed by a psychiatrist or psychologist to have post-traumatic stress disorder, it shall be presumed to

have been incurred during service in the line of duty and shall be

compensable, unless it is shown by a preponderance of the evidence that

the post-traumatic stress disorder was caused by nonservice-connected

risk factors or nonservice-connected exposure. Such person who is diagnosed with post-traumatic stress disorder within three years of the last

active date of employment as a police officer, firefighter, emergency

medical technician, paramedic, emergency dispatcher or other person

certified to provide medical care in emergencies shall be eligible for

benefits under this subdivision.

16 § 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
