AN ACT to amend the public health law, in relation to requiring the commissioner of health to act when areas of lead poisoning are designated

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Section 1. Subdivisions 1 and 3 of section 1373 of the public health law, as added by chapter 338 of the laws of 1970, are amended to read as follows:

4 1. Whenever the commissioner or his <u>or her</u> representative shall desig-5 nate an area of high risk, he [may] <u>or she shall</u> give written notice and 6 demand, served as provided [herein] <u>by this section</u>, for the discontin-7 uance of a paint condition conducive to lead poisoning in any designated 8 dwelling in such area within a specified period of time.

9 3. In the event of failure to comply with a notice and demand, the 10 commissioner or his <u>or her</u> representative [<u>may</u>] <u>shall</u> conduct a formal 11 hearing upon due notice in accordance with the provisions of section 12 twelve-a of this chapter and on proof of violation of such notice and 13 demand [<u>may</u>] <u>shall</u> order abatement of a paint condition conducive to 14 lead poisoning upon such terms as may be appropriate and may assess a 15 penalty not to exceed two thousand five hundred dollars for such 16 violation.

17 § 2. This act shall take effect on the ninetieth day after it shall 18 have become a law.
