AN ACT to amend the education law, in relation to student activity fees

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Section 1. Section 355 of the education law is amended by adding a new 1 2 subdivision 20 to read as follows: 3 20. Student activity fee. a. Disclosure. Every college or universi-4 ty of the state university shall conspicuously post on a publicly acces-5 sible website a notice regarding the student activity fee which shall include, but not be limited to: (1) the purpose of such fee, (2) the б 7 rules and procedures for the allocation of funds from such fee, (3) the 8 name and mission statement of each student organization that received 9 funding from such fee during the previous academic year, (4) the requirement that all funding decisions be made in an open forum where 10 11 all students are given the opportunity to comment, (5) that all funding decisions shall be made in a fair and neutral manner without regard to 12 13 the viewpoints of the organization requesting funding, and (6) that a 14 referendum shall be held at least every two years the purpose of which 15 is to determine whether the student activity fee shall be mandatory or 16 voluntary. 17 b. Referendum. Prior to the close of the first full academic year immediately following the effective date of this subdivision, and at 18 19 least once every two years thereafter, the student body at each college 20 or university operated by the state university shall determine by refer-21 endum whether student activity programs shall be supported by either 22 voluntary or mandatory student fees. Such referendum shall be conducted on campus at an easily accessible polling place or places and at such 23 24 time as shall be convenient for the greatest number of students. Under 25 no circumstances shall funding for any particular organization be deter-

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mined by referendum. Notice of such referendum shall be conspicuously 1 posted at several locations on campus for not less than fifteen days 2 3 prior to the date on which the referendum shall be conducted. Such 4 notice shall include, but not be limited to, the date on which the 5 referendum will be held, the times during which polling places will be б open, the location of all polling places, and the question or questions before the student body. 7 8 c. Eligibility for funding. Any group that is officially recognized by 9 the representative student organization in accordance with procedures 10 established on each campus shall be eligible to receive funding from 11 student activity fee proceeds. d. Disbursement of funds. Proceeds of the student activity fee shall 12 13 disbursed by the representative student organization in a fair and be 14 neutral manner without regard to the viewpoints of the organization requesting funding. All funding decisions shall be made in an open forum 15 16 where members of the student body are given an opportunity to comment. 17 e. Appeal of funding decisions. The representative student organization on each campus shall create an appeals process for registered 18 student organizations complaining of viewpoint discrimination in the 19 20 funding process. After exhausting student review, an aggrieved regis-21 tered student organization may appeal to the chief administrative officer of each campus, or his or her designee. 22 § 2. Section 6215 of the education law is amended by adding a 23 new 24 subdivision 4 to read as follows: 25 4. Student activity fee. a. Disclosure. Every college or university 26 of the city university shall conspicuously post on a publicly accessible 27 website a notice regarding the student activity fee which shall include, but not be limited to: (1) the purpose of such fee, (2) the rules and 28 29 procedures for the allocation of funds from such fee, (3) the name and 30 mission statement of each student organization that received funding 31 from such fee during the previous academic year, (4) the requirement 32 that all funding decisions be made in an open forum where all students 33 are given the opportunity to comment, (5) that all funding decisions shall be made in a fair and neutral manner without regard to the view-34 35 points of the organization requesting funding, and (6) that a referendum 36 shall be held at least every two years the purpose of which is to deter-37 mine whether the student activity fee shall be mandatory or voluntary. 38 b. Referendum. Prior to the close of the first full academic year immediately following the effective date of this subdivision, and at 39 least once every two years thereafter, the student body at each college 40 or university operated by the city university shall determine by refer-41 42 endum whether student activity programs shall be supported by either 43 voluntary or mandatory student fees. Such referendum shall be conducted 44 on campus at an easily accessible polling place or places and at such 45 time as shall be convenient for the greatest number of students. Under 46 no circumstances shall funding for any particular organization be determined by referendum. Notice of such referendum shall be conspicuously 47 48 posted at several locations on campus for not less than fifteen days prior to the date on which the referendum shall be conducted. Such 49 notice shall include, but not be limited to, the date on which the 50 51 referendum will be held, the times during which polling places will be 52 open, the location of all polling places, and the question or questions 53 before the student body. 54 c. Eligibility for funding. Any group that is officially recognized by

All funding decisions shall be made in an open forum 7 where members of the student body are given an opportunity to comment. 8 e. Appeal of funding decisions. The representative student organiza-9 tion on each campus shall create an appeals process for registered 10 student organizations complaining of viewpoint discrimination in the 11 funding process. After exhausting student review, an aggrieved registered student organization may appeal to the chief administrative offi-12 13 cer of each campus, or his or her designee. 14 § 3. Section 6304 of the education law is amended by adding a new subdivision 1-a to read as follows: 15 16 1-a. Student activity fee. a. Disclosure. Every community college shall conspicuously post on a publicly accessible website a notice 17 regarding the student activity fee which shall include, but not be 18 19 limited to: (1) the purpose of such fee, (2) the rules and procedures 20 for the allocation of funds from such fee, (3) the name and mission 21 statement of each student organization that received funding from such fee during the previous academic year, (4) the requirement that all 22 funding decisions be made in an open forum where all students are given 23 the opportunity to comment, (5) that all funding decisions shall be made 24 25 in a fair and neutral manner without regard to the viewpoints of the 26 organization requesting funding, and (6) that a referendum shall be held 27 at least every two years the purpose of which is to determine whether the student activity fee shall be mandatory or voluntary. 28 29 b. Referendum. Prior to the close of the first full academic year 30 immediately following the effective date of this subdivision, and at 31 least once every two years thereafter, the student body at each communi-32 ty college shall determine by referendum whether student activity programs shall be supported by either voluntary or mandatory student 33 34 fees. Such referendum shall be conducted on campus at an easily accessi-35 ble polling place or places and at such time as shall be convenient for the greatest number of students. Under no circumstances shall funding 36 37 for any particular organization be determined by referendum. Notice of 38 such referendum shall be conspicuously posted at several locations on 39 campus for not less than fifteen days prior to the date on which the referendum shall be conducted. Such notice shall include, but not be 40 limited to, the date on which the referendum will be held, the times 41 42 during which polling places will be open, the location of all polling 43 places, and the question or questions before the student body. 44 c. Eligibility for funding. Any group that is officially recognized by 45 the representative student organization in accordance with procedures 46 established on each campus shall be eligible to receive funding from 47 student activity fee proceeds. d. Disbursement of funds.
