AN ACT to amend the village law, in relation to including a high school member on village boards of trustees

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Section 1. Paragraph b of subdivision 1 of section 3-301 of the village law is amended to read as follows:

b. four trustees, except that the board of trustees of a village may change the number of trustees as authorized by section 3-304 of this article, and except that the board of trustees of a village may appoint one student representative to such board as authorized by section 3-305 of this article;

§ 2. The village law is amended by adding a new section 3-305 to read as follows:

§ 3-305 Student representative. The board of trustees by resolution or local law may appoint one student representative to such board. Such student representative shall be a senior in a high school of a school district in which all or part of such school district is contained within such village. The term of such student representative shall be for one year and shall begin on the July first preceding the senior year of such student representative and end the following June thirtieth. A vacancy of such representative may be filled by the board for the remainder of such term. Such student representative shall be entitled to sit with board members at all public meetings of the board and participate in all board hearings and meetings, provided that such student representative shall not be allowed to vote, shall not be allowed to attend executive session, and shall not be entitled to receive compensation of any form.

§ 3. This act shall take effect immediately.
