AN ACT to amend the alcoholic beverage control law, in relation to authorizing the state liquor authority to impose a one year moratorium on the issuance of new licenses to sell liquor on premises in certain instances

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

1 Section 1. Subdivision 2 of section 17 of the alcoholic beverage 2 control law, as amended by chapter 118 of the laws of 2012, is amended 3 to read as follows:

To limit in its discretion the number of licenses of each class to be issued within the state or any political subdivision thereof, and in connection therewith to prohibit the acceptance of applications for such 7 class or classes of licenses which have been so limited. Provided, however, in cities having a population of one million or more, (a) upon receipt of (i) a request from the state senator or state senators and 10 the assembly member or assembly members and the New York city council member or New York city council members representing the residents of a 11 12 neighborhood within a city having a population of one million or more 13 and (ii) a resolution adopted by a community board or boards or other local body or bodies whose jurisdiction covers such neighborhood 15 requesting a moratorium within such neighborhood on the issuance of new licenses to sell liquor at retail for consumption on the premises issued 16 pursuant to sections sixty-four, sixty-four-a, sixty-four-b, 17 sixty-four-c and sixty-four-d of this chapter; and (b) upon a finding by 18 19 the authority that the number of such licenses issued within such neigh-20 borhood pursuant to sections sixty-four, sixty-four-a, sixty-four-b, sixty-four-c and sixty-four-d of this chapter has doubled over a three 21 year period, the authority shall establish a one year moratorium within 2.3 such neighborhood on the issuance of new licenses to sell liquor at

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retail for consumption on the premises issued pursuant to sections sixty-four, sixty-four-a, sixty-four-b, sixty-four-c and sixty-four-d of this chapter and the acceptance of applications for such licenses.

Nothing contained in this subdivision shall prevent the transfer of any license at the same premises under this chapter. For purposes of this subdivision, "neighborhood" means a geographic area within a city having a population of one million or more that is recognized by the residents thereof as including a unique community of interests.

- 9 § 2. Subdivision 2 of section 17 of the alcoholic beverage control 10 law, as amended by chapter 83 of the laws of 1995, is amended to read as 11 follows:
- 2. To limit in its discretion the number of licenses of each class to 12 13 be issued within the state or any political subdivision thereof, and in 14 connection therewith to prohibit the acceptance of applications for such class or classes of licenses which have been so limited. Provided, 15 16 however, in cities having a population of one million or more, (a) upon 17 receipt of (i) a request from the state senator or state senators and the assembly member or assembly members and the New York city council 18 member or New York city council members representing the residents of a 19 20 neighborhood within a city having a population of one million or more 21 and (ii) a resolution adopted by a community board or boards or other 22 local body or bodies whose jurisdiction covers such neighborhood requesting a moratorium within such neighborhood on the issuance of new 23 24 licenses to sell liquor at retail for consumption on the premises issued 25 pursuant to sections sixty-four, sixty-four-a, sixty-four-b, 26 sixty-four-c and sixty-four-d of this chapter; and (b) upon a finding by 27 the authority that the number of such licenses issued within such neighborhood pursuant to sections sixty-four, sixty-four-a, sixty-four-b, 28 sixty-four-c and sixty-four-d of this chapter has doubled over a three 29 30 year period, the authority shall establish a one year moratorium within 31 such neighborhood on the issuance of new licenses to sell liquor at 32 retail for consumption on the premises issued pursuant to sections 33 sixty-four, sixty-four-a, sixty-four-b, sixty-four-c and sixty-four-d of this chapter and the acceptance of applications for such licenses. 34 35 Nothing contained in this subdivision shall prevent the transfer of any 36 license at the same premises under this chapter. For purposes of this 37 subdivision, "neighborhood" means a geographic area within a city having 38 a population of one million or more that is recognized by the residents thereof as including a unique community of interests. 39
- § 3. This act shall take effect immediately, provided that the amendments to subdivision 2 of section 17 of the alcoholic beverage control law made by section one of this act shall be subject to the expiration and reversion of such subdivision pursuant to section 4 of chapter 118 of the laws of 2012, as amended, when upon such date the provisions of section two of this act shall take effect.
