AN ACT to amend the executive law, in relation to enacting the "behavioral health services for veterans act"

## The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Section 1. This act shall be known and may be cited as the "behavioral health services for veterans act".

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- § 2. The executive law is amended by adding a new section 368-a to read as follows:
- § 368-a. Behavioral health services for veterans advisory board. 1. 6 There is hereby established within the division, a behavioral health services for veterans advisory board. Such board shall consist of nine 7 8 members, three of whom shall be appointed by the governor, two of whom 9 shall be appointed by the temporary president of the senate, two of whom 10 shall be appointed by the speaker of the assembly, one of whom shall be 11 appointed by the minority leader of the senate and one of whom shall be appointed by the minority leader of the assembly. Such members shall 12 serve at the pleasure of the appointing authority. Vacancies on the 13 14 board shall be filled in the manner of the original appointment. Members 15 of the board shall receive no compensation for their services but shall 16 be reimbursed for actual and necessary expenses incurred in the perform-17 <u>ance of their duties.</u>
- 2. The behavioral health services for veterans advisory board shall study and analyze both the adequacy of existing and the need for new behavioral health services for veterans. In providing such analysis, the

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board shall work in cooperation with the division, the office of alcoholism and substance abuse services, the department of health and the
department of mental hygiene. The board shall report the findings of
such study to the governor and the legislature along with recommendations it deems necessary for expanded and improved behavioral health
services on or before October first, two thousand nineteen.

§ 3. This act shall take effect April 1, 2019; provided that effective immediately, the addition, amendment and/or repeal of any rule or regulation necessary for the implementation of this act on its effective date are authorized to be made and completed on or before such date.
