AN ACT to amend the election law, in relation to increasing the compensation of election inspectors and other election workers

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

1 Section 1. Subdivision 1 of section 3-420 of the election law, as 2 amended by chapter 180 of the laws of 2005, is amended to read as 3 follows:

4 1. Election inspectors, poll clerks, election coordinators and quali-5 fied voters appointed to act in place of an absent inspector, clerk or coordinator shall be paid for their services on the days of registration б 7 and election, by the county containing the election district in which 8 they serve, in an amount fixed by the county legislative body, subject 9 to such limitations as shall be prescribed or authorized by statute, except that in the city of New York the amount of such compensation 10 11 shall be payable by such city and shall be fixed by the mayor at a daily 12 rate which, in the case of election inspectors shall not be less than one hundred thirty dollars and in the case of election coordinators not 13 less than two hundred dollars. Such inspectors, poll clerks, election 14 15 coordinators and qualified voters at a general or special village election conducted by the board of elections shall be paid by such 16 village in an amount fixed by the village board of trustees subject to 17 18 any such limitations. The compensation payable pursuant to this subdivision of election inspectors, poll clerks, election coordinators, and 19 20 qualified voters appointed to act in place of an absent inspector, 21 clerk, or coordinator, who have or will have been employed in any of 22 such capacities within the county of employment outside the city of New York or within the city of New York for four or more years, shall be 23 24 increased by twenty-five percent of the amount otherwise payable.

25 § 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
