AN ACT to amend the insurance law, in relation to mandatory health insurance coverage for tracking devices for children with developmental disabilities

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Section 1. Subsection (i) of section 3216 of the insurance law is amended by adding a new paragraph 34 to read as follows:

(34) Every policy which provides medical, major medical, or similar comprehensive type coverage shall include coverage for GPS tracking devices to be used on children with developmental disabilities, provided that the treating physician or other licensed health care provider issues a written order stating such device is necessary for the child's welfare.

§ 2. Subsection (l) of section 3221 of the insurance law is amended by adding a new paragraph 20 to read as follows:

(20) Every policy which provides medical, major medical, or similar comprehensive type coverage shall include coverage for GPS tracking devices to be used on children with developmental disabilities, provided that the treating physician or other licensed health care provider issues a written order stating such device is necessary for the child's welfare.

§ 3. Section 4303 of the insurance law is amended by adding a new subsection (rr) to read as follows:

(rr) Every policy which provides medical, major medical, or similar comprehensive type coverage shall include coverage for GPS tracking devices to be used on children with developmental disabilities, provided that the treating physician or other licensed health care provider
