AN ACT to amend the education law, in relation to granting academic credit at state operated institutions of the state university of New York and the senior colleges of the city university of New York to veterans, members of the military, and reservists

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

- Section 1. Section 350 of the education law is amended by adding three 2 new subdivisions 14, 15 and 16 to read as follows:
- 14. "Veteran" means a person, male or female, resident of this state,
 who has served in the active military or naval service of the United
 States during a war in which the United States engaged and who has been
 released from such service by any means other than by dishonorable
 discharge, or who has been furloughed to the reserve.
 - 15. "Member of the military" means any person who is actively enrolled in a branch of the armed forces of the United States.
- 10 <u>16. "Reservist" means any person who is a member of a reserve compo-</u> 11 <u>nent of the armed forces of the United States.</u>

- 12 § 2. The education law is amended by adding a new section 362 to read 13 as follows:
- § 362. Course credit for veterans, members of the military, and reser-15 vists. 1. Every veteran, member of the military, or reservist, as
- 16 defined in section three hundred fifty of this article, who is enrolled
- 17 on a full-time or part-time basis as an undergraduate student in good
- 18 standing at an institution within the state university system shall,
- 19 upon application, be granted up to six academic credits per year and
- 20 sixty credits in the aggregate towards his or her degree for completion
- 21 of courses that were part of such person's military training or service
- 22 if the completed courses meet the standards of the American council on
- 23 education or its equivalent for the awarding of academic credits. No

- 18 § 4. The education law is amended by adding a new section 6217 to read 19 as follows:
 - § 6217. Course credit for veterans, members of the military, and reservists. 1. Every veteran, member of the military, or reservist, as defined in section sixty-two hundred two of this article, who is enrolled on a full-time or part-time basis as an undergraduate student in good standing at an institution within the city university system shall, upon application, be granted up to six academic credits per year and sixty credits in the aggregate towards his or her degree for completion of courses that were part of such person's military training or service if the completed courses meet the standards of the American council on education or its equivalent for the awarding of academic credits. No fee, tuition or other charge shall be assessed against a veteran, member of the military, or reservist, who qualifies for such credit pursuant to this section.
- 2. The board of trustees of the city university of New York shall adopt such procedures as are necessary to fully implement the provisions of this section.
- 36 § 5. This act shall take effect on the first of July next succeeding 37 the date on which it shall have become a law.
