Introduced by M. of A. CARROLL, BARNWELL -- read once and referred to the Committee on Governmental Operations -- committee discharged, bill amended, ordered reprinted as amended and recommitted to said committee -- again reported from said committee with amendments, ordered reprinted as amended and recommitted to said committee

AN ACT to establish a commission to study certain battles and events which were part of the Revolutionary War in New York; and providing for the repeal of such provisions upon the expiration thereof

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Section 1. A commission, to be known as the Revolutionary War in New 2 York commission, is hereby created to study all of the different events and battles that occurred in New York during the Revolutionary War period, including, but not limited to the Battle of Brooklyn, the Battles of Saratoga, the capture and siege of Fort Ticonderoga, the occupation of New York by the British and the British Prison ships in New York Harbor. The study will include methods to promote and educate individuals on the 8 historical importance of the Revolutionary War in New York.

- § 2. The commission shall be composed of thirteen members, appointed 10 as follows: three members shall be appointed by the governor; four members shall be appointed by the speaker of the assembly; one member shall be appointed by the minority leader of the assembly; four members shall be appointed by the temporary president of the senate; and one member shall be appointed by the minority leader of the senate.
- 15 § 3. The commission shall examine and review the historical importance 16 of the Revolutionary War in New York and conduct a study that would 17 analyze how to best foster promotion of this historical event.
- 18 § 4. The commission shall report its findings, conclusions and recom-19 mendations to the governor and the legislature no later than two years 20 after the effective date of this act.
- 21 § 5. This act shall take effect immediately and shall remain in effect 22 until two years after it shall have become a law when upon such date the 23 provisions of this act shall be deemed repealed.
