AN ACT to amend the public health law, in relation to a statewide listing of drug disposal sites and events

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

| 13 | by zip code. It shall also enable pharmacies, manufacturers, whole- |
| 14 | salers, law enforcement agencies, local governments and other entities |
| 15 | to submit information on disposal sites, events, and other options to be |
| 16 | included on the website listing. The department and the department of |
| 17 | environmental conservation shall also develop and publish informational |
| 18 | materials promoting the web-based listing. The web-based listing shall |
| 19 | be made available within one hundred twenty days of the effective date |
| 20 | of this section. |
