AN ACT to amend the public health law, in relation to requiring food allergy signage around parks, playgrounds, and recreation centers

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

- Section 1. The public health law is amended by adding a new section 2500-1 to read as follows:
- § 2500-1. Food allergy awareness signage on playgrounds and in parks and/or recreation centers. 1. Definitions. For the purposes of this section:
- a. "playground" shall have the same meaning as set forth in subdivi
 ion one of section thirteen hundred ninety-nine-o-1 of the public

 health law. Playgrounds or playground equipment constructed upon one,

 two and three-family residential real property are exempt from the

 requirements of this section.
 - b. "park and/or recreation center" shall mean:

- 12 <u>(i) any location within state or municipal parkland that has been</u>
 13 <u>designated in regulation by the commissioner as a place where food</u>
 14 <u>allergy incidents are likely to occur; or</u>
- (ii) any location outside of state or municipal parkland that has been designated in regulation by the commissioner as a place where food allergy incidents are likely to occur, provided that location is being utilized for activities overseen by the office of parks, recreation and historic preservation or a local parks and/or recreation department.
- 2. The commissioner shall promulgate rules and regulations requiring
 the person or entity that operates a playground or a park and/or recreation center to post food allergy awareness signage. At a minimum, such
 signage shall:
- 24 <u>a. inform children and their caregivers of the dangers associated with</u>
 25 <u>food allergies; and</u>

- b. include a list of actions that children and their caregivers can take in order to mitigate the risk of causing an allergy attack, including, but not limited to:
 - (i) eating at designated areas outside of the play or recreation area, in order to avoid food contamination of the playground of other recreation equipment;
 - (ii) not offering food to other children without their caregivers' permission; and
 - (iii) washing or otherwise cleaning their hands after eating.
- 10 § 2. This act shall take effect on the one hundred eightieth day after 11 it shall have become a law; provided, however, that effective immediate-12 ly, the addition, amendment and/or repeal of any rule or regulation 13 necessary for the implementation of this act on its effective date is 14 authorized and directed to be made and completed on or before such 15 effective date.
