AN ACT to amend the general business law, in relation to requiring dogs and cats sold by certain pet dealers to be rescue animals

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Section 1. Subdivision 3 of section 752 of the general business law, as amended by chapter 168 of the laws of 2017, is amended to read as follows:

3. (a) For purposes of section seven hundred fifty-three of this arti-4 cle, a "pet dealer" shall mean any person who, in the ordinary course of 5 6 business, engages in the sale or offering for sale of more than nine 7 animals per year for profit to the public. Such definition shall include breeders of animals who sell or offer for sale animals directly to a 8 consumer but it shall not include any municipal pound or shelter estab-9 10 lished and maintained pursuant to subdivision one of section one hundred 11 fourteen of the agriculture and markets law, or any duly incorporated 12 society for the prevention of cruelty to animals, duly incorporated 13 humane society, duly incorporated animal protective association or other 14 duly incorporated animal adoption or animal rescue organization that is 15 tax exempt pursuant to paragraph (3) of subsection (c) of section 501 of 16 the federal Internal Revenue Code, 26 U.S.C. 501, or any subsequent 17 corresponding sections of the federal Internal Revenue Code, as from time to time amended, that is registered with the department pursuant to 18 section four hundred eight of the agriculture and markets law. For 19 purposes of sections seven hundred fifty-three-a, seven hundred fifty-20 three-b, seven hundred fifty-three-c and seven hundred fifty-three-d of 21 this article, "pet dealer" shall mean any person who engages in the sale 22 or offering for sale of more than nine animals per year for profit to 23 24 the public. Such definition shall include breeders who sell animals; but 25 it shall not include the following:

26 [(a)] <u>(i)</u> Any breeder who sells or offers to sell directly to the 27 consumer fewer than twenty-five animals per year that are born and 28 raised on the breeders residential premises.

[(b)] (ii) Any municipal pound or shelter established and maintained 1 2 pursuant to subdivision one of section one hundred fourteen of the agri-3 culture and markets law. 4 [(a)] (iii) Any duly incorporated society for the prevention of cruel-5 ty to animals, duly incorporated humane society, duly incorporated б animal protective association or other duly incorporated animal adoption 7 or animal rescue organization that is exempt from taxes pursuant to 8 paragraph (3) of subsection (c) of section 501 of the federal Internal 9 Revenue Code, 26 U.S.C. 501, or any subsequent corresponding sections of 10 the federal Internal Revenue Code, as from time to time amended, that is 11 registered with the department pursuant to section four hundred eight of 12 the agriculture and markets law. 13 (b) For purposes of section seven hundred fifty-three-e of this article, a "pet dealer" shall mean a retail pet shop location primarily 14 15 engaged in retailing pets, pet foods, and pet supplies, as defined by 16 the North American industry classification system. Such definition shall 17 not include breeders who sell animals. 18 § 2. The general business law is amended by adding a new section 753-e 19 to read as follows: 20 § 753-e. Requirement of rescue status for certain dispositions. A pet 21 dealer shall not sell or transfer for ownership any animal unless such animal was obtained from a duly incorporated humane society dedicated to 22 the care of unwanted animals, a public animal control agency or shelter, 23 society for the prevention of cruelty to animals shelter, or animal 24 25 rescue or adoption organization. No pet dealer shall take ownership of 26 any such animal from any such duly incorporated humane society, public 27 animal control agency or shelter, society for the prevention of cruelty to animals shelter, or animal rescue or adoption organization, which 28 29 shall retain ownership of the animal while it is in the possession of 30 the pet dealer. Nothing in this section shall be deemed to prohibit a 31 pet dealer from retaining a portion of the adoption fees normally charged by any such organization or shelter when the ownership of an 32 33 animal is transferred to a consumer. 3. Subdivision 1-a of section 755 of the general business law, as 34 S added by chapter 259 of the laws of 2000, is amended to read as follows: 35 36 1-a. Any person who violates any provision of section seven hundred 37 fifty-three-a, seven hundred fifty-three-b, [or] seven hundred fifty-38 three-c or seven hundred fifty-three-e of this article may also be subject to denial, suspension, revocation of, or refusal to renew a pet 39 dealer license, in accordance with the provisions of sections four 40

hundred three and four hundred four of the agriculture and markets law.
