AN ACT to amend the tax law and the public health law, in relation to providing for the taxation of electronic cigarette cartridges

## The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

## Section 1. Subdivision 2 of section 470 of the tax law, as amended by 1 2 section 15 of part D of chapter 134 of the laws of 2010, is amended and 3 two new subdivisions 20 and 21 are added to read as follows: 2. "Tobacco products." Any cigar, including a little cigar, or tobac-4 co, other than cigarettes, intended for consumption by smoking, chewing, 5 vaporizing or as snuff, and shall include e-cigarette cartridges and б 7 electronic cigarette cartridges. 8 20. "Electronic cigarette" or "e-cigarette." A battery-operated device 9 that contains cartridges filled with a combination of nicotine, flavor 10 and/or chemicals that are turned into vapor which is inhaled by the 11 <u>user.</u> 21. "Electronic cigarette cartridge" or "e-cigarette cartridge." A 12 13 replaceable cartridge that contains nicotine or other chemicals and is 14 intended for use within an electronic cigarette or e-cigarette. § 2. Section 1399-aa of the public health law is amended by adding a 15 16 new subdivision 14 to read as follows: 14. "Electronic cigarette cartridge" or "e-cigarette cartridge" means 17 a replaceable cartridge that contains nicotine or other chemicals and is 18 19 intended for use within an electronic cigarette or e-cigarette.

§ 3. This act shall take effect on the one hundred eightieth day after it shall have become a law; provided, however, that the department of taxation and finance is authorized and directed to promulgate rules and regulations necessary for the implementation of this act on or before such date.
