AN ACT to amend the public health law, in relation to the provision of certain professional services to children's camps

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Section 1. Subdivision 1 of section 1394 of the public health law, as added by chapter 515 of the laws of 2000, is amended to read as follows:

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- 1. The public health <u>and health planning</u> council shall prescribe standards and establish regulations for children's overnight, summer day and traveling summer day camps, as defined in this article, concerning such matters as may be appropriate for the protection and security of the life, health and safety of the occupants of such camps.
- § 2. Subdivision 3 of section 1394 of the public health law, as added by chapter 214 of the laws of 2012, is amended to read as follows:

Any person, firm, corporation, or association that operates a chil-10 11 dren's overnight, summer day, or traveling summer day camp, and has 12 obtained a permit pursuant to section thirteen hundred ninety-three of 13 this article, shall be authorized to employ or contract with any of the 14 following licensed professionals, provided however, all decisions, iden-15 <u>tification</u> or <u>coordination</u> of <u>professional services</u>, or <u>other profes-</u> 16 sional interactions with campers and staff, must be made based on the professional judgement of such licensees: (a) a physician, nurse practi-17 tioner, physician assistant, registered nurse, or licensed practical 18 19 nurse or emergency medical technician to act as a designated camp health 20 director or to provide health services in assistance to the camp health 21 director pursuant to applicable regulations promulgated by the commissioner; or (b) a physical therapist, physical therapist assistant under the direction and control of a physical therapist, psychologist, 23 24 licensed behavioral analyst, occupational therapist, occupational thera-

§ 3. This act shall take effect immediately.

py assistant under the direction and supervision of an occupational therapist, licensed master social worker, licensed clinical social worker, licensed clinical social worker, licensed mental health counselor, licensed creative arts therapist or, athletic trainer to provide professional services within his or her lawful scope of practice to campers and staff during their attendance or employment at the camp, pursuant to applicable regulations promulgated by the commissioner in consultation with the commissioner of education.
