AN ACT to amend the public health law, in relation to the provision of certain professional services to children's camps

## The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Section 1. Subdivision 1 of section 1394 of the public health law, as added by chapter 515 of the laws of 2000, is amended to read as follows:

1. The public health <u>and health planning</u> council shall prescribe standards and establish regulations for children's overnight, summer day and traveling summer day camps, as defined in this article, concerning such matters as may be appropriate for the protection and security of the life, health and safety of the occupants of such camps.

- § 2. Subdivision 3 of section 1394 of the public health law, as added by chapter 214 of the laws of 2012, is amended to read as follows:
- 3. Any person, firm, corporation, or association that operates a children's overnight, summer day, or traveling summer day camp, and has
  obtained a permit pursuant to section thirteen hundred ninety-three of
  this article, shall be authorized to employ or contract with any of the
  following licensed professionals, provided however, all decisions, identification or coordination of professional services, or other professional interactions with campers and staff, must be made based on the
  professional judgement of such licensees: a physician, nurse practitioner, physician assistant, registered nurse, or licensed practical nurse
  or emergency medical technician to act as a designated camp health
  director or to provide health services in assistance to the camp health

- 3 § 3. The public health law is amended by adding a new section 1394-c 4 to read as follows:
- § 1394-c. Licensed professionals. 1. Any person, firm, corporation, or association that operates a children's overnight, summer day or travel-7 ing summer day camp, and has obtained a permit pursuant to section thir-8 teen hundred ninety-three of this article, shall be authorized to employ 9 or contract with any of the following licensed professionals: a physical 10 therapist, physical therapist assistant under the direction and control 11 of a physical therapist, psychologist, licensed behavioral analyst, occupational therapist, occupational therapy assistant under the direc-12 tion and supervision of an occupational therapist, licensed master 13 14 social worker, licensed clinical social worker, licensed mental health 15 counselor, licensed creative arts therapist or athletic trainer.
- 2. All decisions, identification or coordination of professional
  services, or other professional interactions with campers and staff,
  must be made based on the professional judgement of such licensees to
  provide professional services within his or her lawful scope of practice
  to campers and staff during their attendance or employment at such camp.
  - 3. Supervision of any licensed professional employed or contracted with by a children's overnight, summer day or traveling summer day camp, pursuant to this section, shall comply with title eight of the education law.
  - 4. Each children's overnight, summer day or traveling summer day camp employing or contracting with a licensed professional, pursuant to this section, shall submit a form, prescribed by the education department, to the board of regents. The education department may charge a fee upon receipt of such form; provided, however, such fee shall not be more than one hundred dollars, except that no such fee shall be more than fifty dollars in the case of a children's overnight, summer day or traveling summer day camp operated by a person, firm, corporation or association for charitable, philanthropic or religious purposes.
- 5. The commissioner in consultation with the commissioner of education shall promulgate rules or regulations in order to administer and effectuate the purposes of this section.
