AN ACT to amend the education law, in relation to school district shared transportation services; and providing for the repeal of such provisions upon expiration thereof

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

1 Section 1. Subdivision 7 of section 3602 of the education law is
2 amended by adding a new paragraph f to read as follows:

3 f. In addition to any other apportionment under this subdivision, for
4 the two thousand eighteen--two thousand nineteen school year and there-
5 after, a public school district other than a city school district in a
6 city having a population of one million or more inhabitants that
7 receives revenue from another public school district or board of cooper-
8 ative educational services for eligible shared transportation services,
9 shall be eligible to offset a portion of such revenue received that
10 reduces total expenses allowable for an apportionment under this subdivi-
11 vision. The amount of such offset under this paragraph shall be equal
12 to the product of (i) the amount of revenue received from another public
13 school district or board of cooperative educational services for provid-
14 ing eligible shared transportation services and (ii) the providing
15 school district's transportation aid ratio under this subdivision. For
16 the purpose of this paragraph, the commissioner shall be authorized to
17 issue guidance on topics including but not limited to the identification
18 of transportation services eligible for sharing among participants, a
19 methodology for calculating the cost of such shared transportation
20 services among participants, and a reporting mechanism by which school
21 districts will be required to demonstrate to the commissioner that such

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1 shared transportation services results in a cost savings to participants
2 as well as to the state.

3 § 2. This act shall take effect on the first of July next succeeding
4 the date upon which it shall have become a law and shall expire and be
5 deemed repealed three years after such date.
