AN ACT to amend the retirement and social security law and the legislative law, in relation to forfeiture of pension rights or retirement benefits upon conviction of a felony related to public employment

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Section 1. The retirement and social security law is amended by adding a new section 157-a to read as follows:

§ 157-a. Pension forfeiture; per diem expense acceptance. 1. Any state officer or local officer, as such terms are defined in section two of the public officers law, who accepts compensation from the state in the form of reimbursement for per diem expenses, in whole or in part, and is convicted in any federal or state court of competent jurisdiction of a felony related to public office, shall be subject to forfeiture of rights of privileges under a public retirement system or pension plan.

- 2. The provisions of subdivisions two, three, four, five, six, seven, 11 eight, nine, ten, eleven, twelve, thirteen and fourteen of section one hundred fifty-seven of this article shall apply to any action for an 13 order to reduce or revoke the pension to which such public official is otherwise entitled for service as a public official.
- § 2. Subdivision 2 of section 5 of the legislative law, as added by 15 section $\, 7 \,$ of part CC of chapter 56 of the laws of 2015, is amended to 16 17 read as follows:

(a) Each member of the legislature, upon verification of attendance, which shall be by electronic verification when practicable, in 19 compliance with the policies set forth by the speaker of the assembly and the temporary president of the senate for their respective bodies, shall be eligible to receive payment of actual and necessary travel

1 expenses and a per diem equivalent to the most recent federal per diem rates published by the general services administration as set forth in 41 CFR (Code of Federal Regulations) Part 301, App. A, for the time in 3 which the member was in travel status in the performance of his or her duties during the months in which the legislature is scheduled to be in regular session. During the months when the legislature is not scheduled 7 to be in regular session, members shall receive such actual and necessary travel expenses and per diems, in compliance with verification 9 policies and in accord with standards and limits for reimbursable events 10 set forth by the speaker of the assembly and the temporary president of 11 the senate for their respective bodies. The per diem allowances including partial per diem allowances shall be made on audit and warrant of 12 13 the comptroller on vouchers approved by the temporary president of the 14 senate or his or her designee and speaker of the assembly or his or her 15 designee for their respective houses. 16

- (b) Each house shall make available on its website all documentation otherwise available to the public pursuant to section eighty-eight of the public officers law related to the payment of travel expenses and per diems.
- 20 (c) Any state officer or local officer, as such terms are defined in 21 section two of the public officers law, who accepts compensation from the state in the form of reimbursement for per diem expenses, in whole 22 or in part, and is convicted in any federal or state court of competent 23 24 jurisdiction of a felony related to public office, shall be subject to 25 forfeiture of rights of privileges under a public retirement system or 26 pension plan. The provisions of subdivisions two, three, four, five, 27 six, seven, eight, nine, ten, eleven, twelve, thirteen and fourteen of section one hundred fifty-seven of the retirement and social security 28 29 law shall apply to any action for an order to reduce or revoke the 30 pension to which such public official is otherwise entitled for service 31 as a public official.
