AN ACT to amend the insurance law, in relation to anti-concurrent causation clauses

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Section 1. The insurance law is amended by adding a new section 3455
to read as follows:
§ 3455. Anti-concurrent causation clauses. An insurer shall not deny
or exclude coverage for any claim for loss or damage that would other wise be covered by a policy solely because an event or peril not covered
under the policy or specifically excluded under the policy was a
contributing factor in such loss or damage or occurred simultaneously
with the event or peril that was covered.
§ 2. This act shall take effect immediately and shall apply to claims

10 made on or after such effective date.
