AN ACT to amend the legislative law and the executive law, in relation to enacting the "legislative online digital paperwork reduction act"

## The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

- Section 1. Short title. This act shall be known and may be cited as the "legislative online digital paperwork reduction act".
- 3 § 2. The legislative law is amended by adding a new section 44-b to 4 read as follows:
- § 44-b. Printing of documents. Notwithstanding any other provision of 6 law, the senate and assembly shall make all legislative reports, digests and records otherwise subject to disclosure pursuant to section eighty-8 eight of the public officers law available on their respective websites in a manner that allows such reports, digests and records to be printed.
- 10 § 3. The executive law is amended by adding a new section 170-c to 11 read as follows:
- § 170-c. Availability of documents. Every state agency in the state 12 13 shall make its annual reports and all other public documents available 14 in a digital format on its website in a manner that allows such reports 15 and documents to be printed. As used in this section, the term "state
- 16 agency" shall mean any department, board, bureau, commission, division,
- office, council, committee or office of the state, a public benefit 17 18 <u>corporation or public authority.</u>
- 19 § 4. This act shall take effect on the ninetieth day after it shall 20 have become a law.
