AN ACT to amend the education law, in relation to requiring pharmacies to post signs regarding the sale of emergency contraception

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

1 Section 1. The education law is amended by adding a new section 6832  
2 to read as follows:

3 § 6832. Display of information relating to emergency contraception.  
4 1. Any pharmacy that does not sell emergency contraception must conspic-  
5 uously post, at or adjacent to each counter over which prescription  
6 drugs are sold, signage indicating in large type that emergency contra-  
7 ception is not sold at such pharmacy.

8 2. Any person who shall violate the provisions of this section shall  
9 pay a civil penalty of not less than two hundred fifty dollars nor more  
10 than five hundred dollars for the first offense and for each succeeding  
11 offense a penalty of not less than five hundred dollars nor more than  
12 seven hundred fifty dollars for each such violation. For the purposes of  
13 this section, if on any single day the required signage is not displayed  
14 in accordance with this section, it shall be considered a single  
15 violation.

16 3. For the purposes of this section, "emergency contraception" means  
17 one or more prescription drugs, used separately or in combination, to be  
18 administered to or self-administered by the patient in a dosage and  
19 manner for preventing pregnancy when used after intercourse, found safe  
20 and effective for that use by the United States food and drug adminis-  
21 tration, and dispensed for that purpose in accordance with professional  
22 standards of practice.

23 § 2. This act shall take effect on the sixtieth day after it shall  
24 have become a law.
