AN ACT to amend the penal law, in relation to theft of transit services

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Section 1. Subdivision 3 of section 165.15 of the penal law is amended 2 to read as follows:

- 3. With intent to obtain [railroad, subway,] bus, air, taxi or any 4 other public transportation service without payment of the lawful charge therefor, or to avoid payment of the lawful charge for such transportation service which has been rendered to him, he obtains or attempts to obtain such service or avoids or attempts to avoid payment therefor by force, intimidation, stealth, deception or mechanical tampering, or by unjustifiable failure or refusal to pay; or
- 10 § 2. The penal law is amended by adding a new section 165.18 to read 11 as follows:
- 12 § 165.18 Theft of transit services.

- 13 A person is guilty of theft of transit services when with intent to 14 obtain railroad or subway service without payment of the lawful charge 15 therefor, or to avoid payment of the lawful charge for such transporta-16 tion service which has been rendered to him or her, he or she obtains or attempts to obtain such service or avoids or attempts to avoid payment 17 18 therefor by force, intimidation, stealth, deception or mechanical 19 tampering, or by unjustifiable failure or refusal to pay.
- 20 Theft of transit services is a violation, provided however, where the 21 <u>defendant has previously been convicted of this offense within the three</u> 22 years immediately preceding such violation, it shall be punishable by a 23 fine of not more than five hundred dollars.
  - § 3. This act shall take effect immediately.
