AN ACT to amend the education law and the public health law, in relation to registration in the donate life registry

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

1 Section 1. The education law is amended by adding a new section 209-b 2 to read as follows:

§ 209-b. Initial registration; registration in the donate life registry. The regents shall provide a space on each student's initial registration form so that the student may register in the New York state donate life registry under section forty-three hundred ten of the public health law with the following stated on the application in clear and conspicuous type:

9 <u>"Would you like to be added to the Donate Life Registry? Check box for</u>
10 <u>'yes' or 'skip this question'."</u>

The regents shall not maintain records of any person who checks "skip this question". Except where the application is made in person or electronically, failure to check "yes" or checking "skip this question" shall not be construed to imply a wish not to donate. In the case of an applicant under sixteen years of age, checking "yes" shall not constitute consent to make an anatomical gift or registration in the donate life registry. Where an applicant has previously consented to make an anatomical gift or registery, checking "skip this question" or failing to check a box shall not impair that consent or registration.

21 § 2. The education law is amended by adding a new section 262-a to 22 read as follows:

 § 262-a. Application for library card; registration in the donate life registry. Every library, other than a school library, shall provide a space on the application for a library card so that the applicant may register in the New York state donate life registry under section forty-three hundred ten of the public health law with the following stated on the application in clear and conspicuous type:

"Would you like to be added to the Donate Life Registry? Check box for 'yes' or 'skip this question'."

The department shall not maintain records of any person who checks "skip this question". Except where the application is made in person or electronically, failure to check "yes" or checking "skip this question" shall not be construed to imply a wish not to donate. In the case of an applicant under sixteen years of age, checking "yes" shall not constitute consent to make an anatomical gift or registration in the donate life registry. Where an applicant has previously consented to make an anatomical gift or register in the donate life registry, checking "skip this question" or failing to check a box shall not impair that consent or registration.

§ 3. Subdivision 1 of section 206 of the public health law is amended by adding two new paragraphs (w) and (x) to read as follows:

(w) require, in consultation and cooperation with the board of regents of The University of the State of New York, that every individual registering at a SUNY or CUNY school pursuant to section two hundred nine-b of the education law, be provided space so that such applicant may register in the "donate life registry" for organ, eye and tissue donations under section forty-three hundred ten of this chapter with the following stated in clear and conspicuous type:

"Would you like to be added to the Donate Life Registry? Check box for 'yes' or 'skip this question'."

The commissioner shall not maintain records of any person who checks "skip this question". Except where the application is made in person or electronically, failure to check "yes" or checking "skip this question" shall not be construed to imply a wish not to donate. In the case of an applicant under sixteen years of age, checking "yes" shall not constitute consent to make an anatomical gift or registration in the donate life registry. Where an applicant has previously consented to make an anatomical gift or register in the donate life registry, checking "skip this question" or failing to check a box shall not impair that consent or registration.

(x) require, in consultation and cooperation with the department of health, that every individual applying for a library card at a public library pursuant to section two hundred sixty-two-a of the education law, be provided space so that such applicant may register in the "donate life registry" for organ, eye and tissue donations under section forty-three hundred ten of this chapter with the following stated in clear and conspicuous type:

"Would you like to be added to the Donate Life Registry? Check box for 'yes' or 'skip this question'."

The commissioner shall not maintain records of any person who checks "skip this question". Except where the application is made in person or electronically, failure to check "yes" or checking "skip this question" shall not be construed to imply a wish not to donate. In the case of an applicant under sixteen years of age, checking "yes" shall not constitute consent to make an anatomical gift or registration in the donate life registry. Where an applicant has previously consented to make an anatomical gift or register in the donate life registry, checking "skip

this question" or failing to check a box shall not impair that consent or registration.

- § 4. Paragraph (a) of subdivision 5 and subdivision 9 of section 4310 of the public health law, paragraph (a) of subdivision 5 as separately amended by chapters 40 and 248 of the laws of 2016, subdivision 9 as added by section 27 of part A of chapter 60 of the laws of 2014, are amended to read as follows:
- Such organ, eye and tissue registration of consent to make an anatomical gift can be made through: (i) indication made on the application or renewal form of a driver's license, (ii) indication made on a non-driver identification card application or renewal form, (iii) indication made on a voter registration form pursuant to subdivision five of section 5-210 of the election law, (iv) indication made on the application for health care coverage offered through the state health benefit exchange, (v) enrollment through the donate life registry website, (vi) paper enrollment submitted to the donate life registry, [ex] (vii) indication made on the initial registration for a SUNY or CUNY school pursuant to section two hundred nine-b of the education law; (viii) indication made on the application for a library card pursuant to section two hundred sixty-two-a the education law, or (ix) through any other method identified by the commissioner. The department shall establish a means by which to register the consent given by individuals who are sixteen or seventeen years of age in the donate life registry, and shall make registration available by any of the methods provided in subparagraphs (i), (ii), (iii), (iv), (v) [and], (vi), (vii), and (viii) of this paragraph.
- 9. An interagency work group, composed of the commissioner, the commissioner of the department of motor vehicles, a chair of the board elections, a regent of The State University of New York, or their designees, and such other individuals as may be designated by the commissioner, shall be established to meet with the contractor annually and as needed to review the status of the donate life registry, to examine the steps that might be taken by state agencies to enhance its performance and to make recommendations to the contractor.
- § 5. Paragraph (a) of subdivision 5 of section 4310 of the public health law, as amended by section 27 of part A of chapter 60 of the laws of 2014, is amended to read as follows:
- (a) Such organ, eye and tissue registration of consent to make an anatomical gift can be made through: (i) indication made on the application or renewal form of a driver's license, (ii) indication made on a non-driver identification card application or renewal form, (iii) indication made on a voter registration form pursuant to subdivision five of section 5-210 of the election law, (iv) enrollment through the donate life registry website, (v) paper enrollment submitted to the donate life registry, [ex] (vi) indication made on the initial registration for a SUNY or CUNY school pursuant to section two hundred nine-b of the education law, (vii) indication made on the application for a library card pursuant to section two hundred sixty-two-a of the education law, or (viii) through any other method identified by the commissioner.
- § 6. This act shall take effect immediately, provided that the amendments to paragraph (a) of subdivision 5 of section 4310 of the public health law made by section four of this act shall be subject to the expiration and reversion of such subdivision pursuant to section 6 of 54 chapter 465 of the laws of 2012, as amended, when upon such date the provisions of section five of this act shall take effect.
