AN ACT to amend the public health law, in relation to incorporating
additional information in the physician profile and streamlining
reporting requirements; and to amend the education law, in relation to
requiring health care practitioners to provide and the state education
department to collect information about the practice of their
professions and in relation to providing practitioners with informa-
tion on enrolling in the New York state donate life registry for
organ, eye and tissue donations

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assem-
bly, do enact as follows:

1 Section 1. Subdivision 1 of section 2995-a of the public health law,
2 as added by chapter 542 of the laws of 2000, paragraph (h) as amended by
3 section 1 of part A of chapter 57 of the laws of 2015, is amended to
4 read as follows:
5 1. The department shall collect the following information and create
6 individual profiles on licensees subject to the authority of the office
7 of professional medical conduct, in a format that shall be available for
8 dissemination to the public:
9 (a) a statement of any criminal convictions (as defined by section
10 1.20 of the criminal procedure law) within the most recent ten years,
11 under the laws of New York state or any other jurisdiction, for offenses
12 specified by regulations of the department;
13 (b) a statement of any action (other than an action that remains
14 confidential) taken against the licensee pursuant to section two hundred
15 thirty of this chapter or any similar action taken by any other state or
16 licensing entity, within the most recent ten years;
17 (c) a statement of any current limitation of the licensee to a speci-
18 fied area, type, scope or condition of practice;

EXPLANATION--Matter in italics (underscored) is new; matter in brackets
[-] is old law to be omitted.

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(d) a statement of any loss or involuntary restriction of hospital privileges or a failure to renew professional privileges at hospitals within the last ten years, for reasons related to the quality of patient care delivered or to be delivered by the physician where procedural due process has been afforded, exhausted, or waived, or the resignation from or removal of medical staff membership or restriction of privileges at a hospital taken in lieu of a pending disciplinary case related to the quality of patient care delivered or to be delivered by the physician (notwithstanding paragraph (a) of subdivision three of section twenty-eight hundred three-e of this chapter, as added by chapter eight hundred sixty-six of the laws of nineteen hundred eighty);

(e) (i) a statement indicating the number of medical malpractice court judgments and arbitration awards within the most recent ten years in which a payment is awarded to a complaining party (notwithstanding subsection (f) of section three hundred fifteen of the insurance law); and

(ii) a statement indicating all malpractice settlements within the most recent ten years in which payment is awarded to a complaining party (notwithstanding subsection (f) of section three hundred fifteen of the insurance law),

(A) if the total number of settlements exceeds two; or

(B) if the commissioner determines any such settlement could be relevant to patient decisionmaking concerning health care quality. The statement shall include the following: "Settlement payments will appear in this profile only if the total number of settlements made within the past ten years exceeds two, or if the commissioner of health determines a settlement to be relevant to patient decisionmaking. Settlement of a claim may occur for a variety of reasons, which do not necessarily reflect negatively on the professional competence or conduct of the physician. A payment in settlement of a medical malpractice action or claim does not necessarily mean that a medical malpractice has occurred." The commissioner may supplement such statement as may be appropriate.

(iii) judgments, awards and settlements shall be reported in graduated categories indicating the level of significance, date and place of the judgment, award or settlement. Information concerning medical malpractice judgments, awards and settlements shall be put in context by comparing an individual licensee's medical malpractice settlements to the experience of other physicians in New York state within the same board specialty. Pending malpractice claims shall not be disclosed to the public under this section. Nothing herein shall be construed to prevent the board from investigating or disciplining a licensee on the basis of medical malpractice claims that are pending;

(f) name of medical schools attended and date of graduations;

(g) graduate medical education;

(h) current specialty board certification and date of certification;

(i) dates admitted to practice in New York state;

(j) names of hospitals where the licensee has practice privileges;

(k) appointments to medical school faculties and indication as to whether a licensee has had a responsibility for graduate medical education within the most recent ten years;

(l) information regarding publications in peer reviewed medical literature within the most recent ten years;

(m) information regarding professional or community service activities or awards;

(n) (i) the location of the licensee's primary practice setting identified as such; ~~[and]~~

(ii) ~~[the names of any licensed physicians with whom the licensee shares a group practice, as defined in subdivision five of section two hundred thirty-eight of this chapter]~~ hours of operation of the licensee's primary practice setting;

(iii) availability of assistive technology at the licensee's primary practice setting; and

(iv) whether the licensee is accepting new patients;

(o) the identification of any translating services that may be available at the licensee's primary practice location;

(p) whether the licensee participates in the medicaid or medicare program or any other state or federally financed health insurance program; ~~[and]~~

(q) health care plans with which the licensee has contracts, employment, or other affiliation~~[+]~~;

(r) physician's website and social media accounts;

(s) the names of any licensed physicians with whom the licensee shares a group practice, as defined in subdivision five of section two hundred thirty-eight of this chapter; and

(t) workforce research and planning information as determined by the commissioner.

§ 2. Section 2995-a of the public health law is amended by adding a new subdivision 1-b to read as follows:

1-b. For the purposes of this section, a physician licensed and registered to practice in this state may authorize a designee to maintain and update his or her profile information on the physician's behalf, provided that: (a) the designee so authorized is employed by the physician; (b) the physician remains responsible for ensuring that information provided for the profile by the designee is accurate; and (c) liability pursuant to subdivision seven of this section remains with the physician.

§ 3. Subdivision 4 of section 2995-a of the public health law, as amended by section 3 of part A of chapter 57 of the laws of 2015, is amended to read as follows:

4. Each physician shall periodically report to the department on forms and in the time and manner required by the commissioner any other information as is required by the department for the development of profiles under this section which is not otherwise reasonably obtainable. In addition to such periodic reports and providing the same information, each physician shall update his or her profile information within the six months prior to ~~[the expiration date of such physician's registration period]~~ submission of the re-registration application, as a condition of registration renewal ~~[under article one hundred thirty-one pursuant to section sixty-five hundred twenty-four of the education law.~~ Except for optional information provided and information required under paragraph (t) of subdivision one of this section, physicians shall notify the department of any change in the profile information within thirty days of such change.

§ 4. Subdivision 6 of section 2995-a of the public health law, as added by chapter 542 of the laws of 2000, is amended to read as follows:

6. A physician may elect to have his or her profile omit certain information provided pursuant to paragraphs (k), (l), (m), ~~[(n) and (q)]~~ (r), and (s) of subdivision one of this section. Information provided pursuant to paragraph (t) of subdivision one of this section shall be omitted from a physician's profile. In collecting information for such

1 profiles and disseminating the same, the department shall inform physi-
2 cians that they may choose not to provide such information required
3 pursuant to paragraphs (k), (l), (m), [~~(n) and (q)~~] (r), and (s) of
4 subdivision one of this section.

5 § 5. Section 6524 of the education law is amended by adding a new
6 subdivision 12 to read as follows:

7 (12) In conjunction with and as a condition of each biennial registra-
8 tion, each physician shall provide to the department, and the department
9 shall collect, such information and documentation required by the
10 department, in consultation with the department of health, as is neces-
11 sary to enable the department of health to evaluate access to needed
12 services in this state, including, but not limited to, the location and
13 type of setting wherein the physician practices and other information
14 the department, in consultation with the department of health, deems
15 relevant. The department of health, in consultation with the department,
16 shall make such data available in aggregate, de-identified form on a
17 publicly accessible website. Additionally, in conjunction with each
18 biennial registration, the department, in consultation with the depart-
19 ment of health, shall provide information on registering in the donate
20 life registry for organ and tissue donation, including the website
21 address for such registry.

22 § 6. Section 6541 of the education law is amended by adding a new
23 subdivision 4 to read as follows:

25 tion, each physician assistant shall provide to the department, and the
26 department shall collect, such information and documentation required by
27 the department, in consultation with the department of health, as is
28 necessary to enable the department of health to evaluate access to need-

31 information the department, in consultation with the department of

(4) Education and experience: (A) have received a high school diploma, or its equivalent, and (B) have successfully completed, in accordance with the commissioner's regulations, (i) an approved one-year course of study in dental assisting in a degree-granting institution or a board of cooperative educational services program which includes at least two hundred hours of clinical experience, or an equivalent approved course of study in dental assisting in a non-degree granting institution which shall not be a professional association or professional organization or (ii) an alternate course of study in dental assisting acceptable to the department which shall be provided by a degree-granting institution or a board of cooperative educational services program which includes at least one thousand hours of relevant work experience; ~~and~~

(5) Examination: pass an examination given by an organization which administers examinations for certifying dental assistants and which is acceptable to the department~~[-]~~; ~~and~~

(6) Information and documentation: in conjunction with and as a condition of each triennial registration, provide to the department, and the department shall collect, such information and documentation required by the department, in consultation with the department of health, as is necessary to enable the department of health to evaluate access to needed services in this state, including, but not limited to, the location and type of setting wherein the certified dental assistant practices and other information the department, in consultation with the department of health, deems relevant. The department of health, in consultation with the department, shall make such data available in aggregate, de-identified form on a publicly accessible website. Additionally, in conjunction with each triennial registration, the department, in consultation with the department of health, shall provide information on registering in the donate life registry for organ and tissue donation, including the website address for such registry.

§ 11. Subdivisions 7 and 8 of section 6609 of the education law, subdivision 7 as added by chapter 987 of the laws of 1971 and subdivision 8 as amended by chapter 62 of the laws of 1989, are amended and a new subdivision 9 is added to read as follows:
