AN ACT to amend the public health law and the education law, in relation to establishing a specific protocol regarding religious exemptions to immunizations in schools

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

1 Section 1. Section 2164 of the public health law is amended by adding 2 a new subdivision 10-a to read as follows:

10-a. The commissioner shall work in conjunction with the commissioner of education to establish a protocol with specific criteria for all children described in subdivision nine of this section to qualify for the religious vaccination exemption. Prior to an individual being permitted to submit a request for religious exemption to immunization form, required under 10 NYCRR 66-1.3(d), such individual must be approved under such established protocol. Such protocol shall be created and put into effect prior to the two thousand seventeen--two thousand eighteen school year.
