AN ACT to amend the alcoholic beverage control law, in relation to allowing bed and breakfasts to sell cider, liquor, beer and wine

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Section 1. Subdivision 4 of section 51 of the alcoholic beverage control law, as amended by chapter 431 of the laws of 2014, is amended 2 to read as follows:

- 4. A licensed brewery may operate a restaurant, hotel, bed and breakfast, catering establishment, or other food and drinking establishment in or adjacent to the licensed premises and sell at such place, at retail for consumption on the premises, beer manufactured by the licensee and any New York state labeled beer. All of the provisions of this chapter relative to licenses to sell beer at retail for consumption on 10 the premises shall apply so far as applicable to such licensee. 11 Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the licensed brewer may apply to the liquor authority for a license to sell beer, wine or liquor at retail for consumption on the premises at such establishment. All of the provisions of this chapter relative to licenses to sell beer, wine 15 or liquor at retail for consumption on the premises shall apply so far as applicable to such application.
- § 2. Paragraph (g) of subdivision 2 of section 51-a of the alcoholic 17 18 beverage control law, as amended by chapter 431 of the laws of 2014, is amended to read as follows: 19
- 20 (g) operate a restaurant, hotel, bed and breakfast, catering estab-21 lishment, or other food and drinking establishment in or adjacent to the licensed premises and sell at such place, at retail for consumption on the premises, beer and cider manufactured by the licensee and any New 24 York state labeled beer or New York state labeled cider. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the licensed farm cidery may apply to the authority for a license under this chapter to sell other alcoholic beverages at retail for consumption on the premises at such establishment;
- 19 § 4. Subparagraph (ii) of paragraph (e) of subdivision 2-c of section 20 of the alcoholic beverage control law, as amended by chapter 431 of 21 the laws of 2014, is amended to read as follows:
 - (ii) operate a restaurant, hotel, bed and breakfast, catering establishment, or other food and drinking establishment in or adjacent to the licensed premises and sell at such place, at retail for consumption on the premises, liquor manufactured by the licensee and any New York state labeled liquor. All of the provisions of this chapter relative to licenses to sell liquor at retail for consumption on the premises shall apply so far as applicable to such licensee. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the licensee may apply to the authority for a license under this chapter to sell other alcoholic beverages at retail for consumption on the premises at such establishment.
- 32 5. Subdivision 5-a of section 64 of the alcoholic beverage control 33 law, as added by chapter 480 of the laws of 2003, is amended to read as 34 follows:
 - 5-a. Notwithstanding the provisions of subdivision five of this section, a liquor license may be issued under this section to an establishment designated and commonly known and operated as a "bed and breakfast" regardless of whether or not a restaurant is operated in such establishment[, provided that such lisense shall only permit the sale of alcoholic beverages to overnight guests of such establishment].
 - § 6. Subdivision 4-a of section 76 of the alcoholic beverage control law, as amended by chapter 431 of the laws of 2014, is amended to read as follows:
- 44 4-a. A licensed winery may operate a restaurant, hotel, bed and break-45 fast, catering establishment, or other food and drinking establishment 46 in or adjacent to the licensed premises and sell at such place, at 47 retail for consumption on the premises, wine and wine products manufactured by the licensee and any New York state labeled wine or New York 48 49 state labeled wine product. All of the provisions of this chapter rela-50 tive to licenses to sell wine at retail for consumption on the premises 51 shall apply so far as applicable to such licensee. Notwithstanding any 52 other provision of law, the licensed winery may apply to the authority for a license under article four of this chapter to sell other alcoholic 54 beverages at retail for consumption on the premises at such establish-55 ment.

§ 7. Paragraph (f) of subdivision 2 of section 76-a of the alcoholic
beverage control law, as amended by chapter 431 of the laws of 2014, is
amended to read as follows:

- (f) operate a restaurant, hotel, <u>bed and breakfast</u>, catering establishment, or other food and drinking establishment in or adjacent to the licensed premises and sell at such place, at retail for consumption on the premises, wine, cider and wine products manufactured by the licensee and any New York state labeled wine, New York state labeled cider or New York state labeled wine product. All of the provisions of this chapter relative to licenses to sell wine at retail for consumption on the premises shall apply so far as applicable to such licensee. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the licensed winery may apply to the authority for a license under article four of this chapter to sell other alcoholic beverages at retail for consumption on the premises at such establishment.
- 16 § 8. This act shall take effect immediately.
