AN ACT to amend the public housing law, in relation to the New York city housing authority performing lead paint inspections and hiring tenants to repaint apartments; and making an appropriation therefor

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

1 Section 1. The public housing law is amended by adding a new section
2 402-d to read as follows:

3 § 402-d. Reporting on lead based paint; repainting of apartments. 1.
4 The New York city housing authority shall submit an annual lead based
5 paint report on or before the first of December of each year to the
6 governor, temporary president of the senate, speaker of the assembly,
7 minority leader of the senate and the minority leader of the assembly,
8 including, but not limited to, the number of lead based paint
9 inspections performed by such authority, the results of such
10 inspections, the number of inspectors such authority has and any other
11 information the chair and chief executive officer of such authority
12 deems pertinent.

13 2. The New York city housing authority shall at least once every two
14 and a half years have every apartment under control of such authority
15 repainted. Such authority shall hire its tenants to repaint the apart-
16 ments.

17 § 2. The sum of one million dollars (\$1,000,000), or so much thereof
18 as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated to the New York city housing
19 authority out of any moneys in the state treasury in the general fund to
20 the credit of the state purposes account not otherwise appropriated for
21 such authority to hire additional lead based paint inspectors. Such
22 moneys shall be payable on the audit and warrant of the comptroller on
23 vouchers certified or approved by the New York city housing authority in
24 the manner prescribed by law.

25 § 3. This act shall take effect immediately.
