AN ACT to amend the executive law and the education law, in relation to authorizing certain school personnel to wear personal safety alarms

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

1 Section 1. The executive law is amended by adding a new section 214-f
2 to read as follows:

3 § 214-f. School safety. The superintendent, in consultation with the
4 commissioner of education, shall establish a school safety program, that
5 school districts may opt into at local option, in which teachers and
6 other school personnel who have significant daily student contact are
7 equipped with personal safety alarms. The superintendent shall set mini-
8 mum requirements for the development and functionality of such personal
9 safety alarms including, but not limited to, the alert system estab-
10 lished between each district and their local police department, fire
11 station and medical assistance provider. For purposes of this section, a
12 "personal safety alarm" shall mean a wearable device that once acti-
13 vated, by the pressing of an emergency button, shall alert first respon-
14 ders, including but not limited to police, firefighters and medical
15 assistance, of an emergency.

16 § 2. Section 305 of the education law is amended by adding a new
17 subdivision 57 to read as follows:

18 57. a. The commissioner, in consultation with the superintendent of
19 state police, shall promulgate rules and regulations to allow the board
20 of education or trustees of any school district in the state to provide
21 for the use by, and distribution of personal safety alarms to teachers
22 and other school personnel who have significant daily student contact.

23 b. For purposes of this section, a "personal safety alarm" shall mean
24 a wearable device that once activated, by the pressing of an emergency
25 button, shall alert first responders, including but not limited to
26 police, firefighters and medical assistance, of an emergency.

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1 c. The commissioner shall submit an annual report containing the
2 amount of distributed personal safety alarms by school district to the
3 speaker of the assembly and the temporary president of the senate.

4 § 3. Section 3602 of the education law is amended by adding a new
5 subdivision 19 to read as follows:

6 19. In addition to the apportionments payable to a school district
7 pursuant to this section, the commissioner is hereby authorized to
8 apportion to any school district additional aid pursuant to this subdi-
9 vision for its approved expenditures in the base year for the purchase
10 of personal safety alarms. The commissioner shall annually prescribe a
11 special cost allowance for such personal safety alarms and the approved
12 expenditures shall not exceed such cost allowance.

13 § 4. This act shall take effect on the ninetieth day after it shall
14 have become a law. Effective immediately, the addition, amendment and/or
15 repeal of any rule or regulation necessary for the implementation of
16 this act on its effective date are authorized to be made and completed
17 on or before such effective date.
