- AN ACT to amend the general business law, in relation to prohibiting the sale of dry ice to individuals under twenty-one years of age

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

1	Section 1. The general business law is amended by adding a new section
2	399-hh to read as follows:
3	<u>§ 399-hh. Prohibits the sale of dry ice to individuals under eighteen</u>
4	years of age. 1. No person, corporation, partnership or limited liabil-
5	ity company shall knowingly sell or offer for sale dry ice to an indi-
б	<u>vidual under eighteen years of age.</u>
7	2. Any person, corporation, partnership or limited liability company
8	selling or offering for sale dry ice shall require proof of legal age
9	prior to allowing an individual to purchase dry ice. Such identification
10	need not be required of any individual who reasonably appears to be at
11	least twenty-five years of age, provided, however, that such appearance
12	shall not constitute a defense in any proceeding alleging the sale of
13	<u>dry ice to an individual under eighteen years of age.</u>
14	3. Any person, corporation, partnership or limited liability company
15	which violates the provisions of this section shall be subject to a
16	civil penalty of not more than five hundred dollars per violation.
17	§ 2. This act shall take effect on the sixtieth day after it shall
18	have become a law.
