AN ACT to amend the executive law, in relation to application of the state uniform fire prevention and building code to certain premises

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

1 Section 1. Section 383 of the executive law is amended by adding a new  
2 subdivision 5 to read as follows:

3 5. Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, the code  
4 shall apply to all buildings and structures owned by or in which space  
5 is leased by state agencies and covered authorities, as such terms are  
6 defined in section two-a of the state finance law, irrespective of when  
7 such buildings or structures were built or put into service. Existing  
8 buildings and structures constructed before the effective date of this  
9 subdivision shall be subject to the code pursuant to a staged plan  
10 developed by the office of general services, which may provide for  
11 compliance over a period of not more than five years, or if the office  
12 of general services shall determine that there are reasons requiring  
13 delay, within ten years, unless such building or structure is altered,  
14 in which case the code shall immediately apply to all alterations to  
15 such building or structure provided, however, that subsequent to the  
16 effective date of this subdivision, the legislature may exempt a specif-  
17 ic building or structure, which shall be identified by its legal  
18 description and street address, if applicable, from the provisions of  
19 this subdivision.

20 § 2. This act shall take effect on the one hundred eightieth day after  
21 it shall have become a law.
