AN ACT authorizing the alienation of certain parklands in the town of Tonawanda, county of Erie

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Section 1. Subject to the provisions of this act, the town of Tonawanda, in the county of Erie, acting by and through its governing body, is hereby authorized to discontinue as parklands and alienate the lands more particularly described in section three of this act for the purpose of leasing such lands for the placement and operation of a cellular tower facility.
§ 2. The authorization provided in section one of this act shall be effective only upon the condition that the town of Tonawanda shall dedicate the lands described in section four of this act as additional parkland of the town.
§ 3. The lands authorized by section one of this act to be discontinued as parklands are described as follows:

All that piece or parcel of property situated in the Town of Tonawanda, County of Erie and State of New York, and more particularly described as follows:

Beginning at the intersection formed by the centerline of Brompton Road (49.5 feet wide) and the centerline of Parker Boulevard;

Thence North 86 degrees 53 minutes 32 seconds West a distance of 1592 $+/-$ feet to the true point of beginning;

Thence South 00 degrees 12 minutes 19 seconds West a distance of 50 feet to a point;

Thence North 89 degrees 47 minutes 41 seconds West a distance of 50 feet to a point;

Thence North 00 degrees 12 minutes 19 seconds East a distance of 50 feet to a point;

Thence South 89 degrees 47 minutes 41 seconds East a distance of 50 feet to the place and point of beginning;

Said parcel containing 2,500 square feet ( 0.057 acres).
EXPLANATION--Matter in italics (underscored) is new; matter in brackets [-] is old law to be omitted.

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Together with an access easement, bounded and described as follows:
Beginning at a point in the south highway boundary line of Brompton Road, said point being North 69 degrees 39 minutes 15 seconds West, a distance of $1414+/-$ feet from the intersection formed by the centerline of Brompton Road (49.5 feet wide) and the centerline of Parker Boulevard;

Thence South 21 degrees 21 minutes 20 seconds West a distance of 54.30 feet to a point;

Thence South 15 degrees 13 minutes 31 seconds West a distance of 90.98 feet to a point;

Thence South 29 degrees 47 minutes 25 seconds West a distance of 48.75 feet to a point;

Thence South 89 degrees 57 minutes 25 seconds West a distance of 175.76 feet to a point;

Thence South 00 degrees 12 minutes 19 seconds West a distance of 274.50 feet to a point;

Thence North 89 degrees 47 minutes 41 seconds West a distance of 20 feet to a point;

Thence North 00 degrees 12 minutes 19 seconds East a distance of 294.41 feet to a point;

Thence North 89 degrees 57 minutes 25 seconds East a distance of 184.09 feet to a point;

Thence North 29 degrees 47 minutes 25 seconds East a distance of 34.61 feet to a point;

Thence North 15 degrees 13 minutes 31 seconds East a distance of 89.50 feet to a point;

Thence North 21 degrees 21 minutes 20 seconds East a distance of 55.53 feet to a point in the south highway boundary line of Brompton Road;

Thence South 68 degrees 10 minutes 54 seconds East a distance of 20 feet to the place and point of beginning;

Said parcel containing 13,024 square feet ( 0.299 acres).
§ 4. The town of Tonawanda, acting by and through its governing body, shall acquire and dedicate the replacement lands for use as parkland for public park purposes described as follows: All that piece or parcel of property situated in the Town of Hempstead, County of Nassau and State of New York being part of Lot 45, Township 12, Range 8 of the Holland Land Company's survey and being more particularly described as follows: Beginning at a point at the intersection of the northerly line of E.G.H. Youngmann Expressway and the easterly line of Two Mile Creek Road; Thence along the northerly boundary of E.G.H. Youngmann Expressway at azimuth North 75 degrees minus 49 minutes minus 34 seconds East a distance of 428.21 feet to the point and place of beginning; Thence northerly, at azimuth South 06 degrees minus 51 minutes minus 25 seconds East a distance of 684.04 feet to a point; Thence northerly, at azimuth South 10 degrees minus 12 minutes minus 52 seconds East a distance of 402.34 feet to a point on the southerly line of Pirson Parkway; Thence easterly, at azimuth South 80 degrees minus 59 minutes minus 41 seconds West along said line a distance of 285.85 feet to a point; Thence southerly, at azimuth South 11 degrees minus 41 minutes minus 3.5 seconds West a distance of 609.87 to a point on the westerly line of East Park Drive; Thence southerly, at azimuth South 06 degrees minus 06 minutes minus 34 seconds East a distance of 213.00 feet to a point; Thence westerly, at azimuth South 75 degrees minus 49 minutes minus 34 seconds East a distance of 180.00 to a point; Thence southerly, at azimuth South 07 degrees minus 00 minutes minus 26 seconds East a distance of 236.09 feet to a point on the northerly line of E.G.H. Youngmann Expressway;

Thence westerly, at azimuth South 75 degrees minus 49 minutes minus 54 seconds East a distance 133.68 feet to the point and place of beginning; Said parcel containing 6.48 acres more or less.
§ 5. In the event that the parklands described in section four of this act to be acquired and dedicated by the town of Tonawanda pursuant to this act are not equal to or greater than the parklands described in section three of this act being alienated, the town of Tonawanda shall dedicate the difference of the fair market value of the lands to be alienated and the lands to be dedicated for the acquisition of additional parklands and/or capital improvements to existing park and recreational facilities.
§ 6. In the event that the town of Tonawanda received any funding support or assistance from the federal government for the purchase, maintenance or improvement of the parklands set forth in section three of this act, the discontinuance and alienation of such parklands authorized by the provisions of section three of this act shall not occur until the town of Tonawanda has complied with any federal requirements pertaining to the alienation or conversion of such parklands, including satisfying the secretary of the interior that the alienation or conversion complies with all conditions which the secretary of the interior deems necessary to assure the substitution of other lands shall be equivalent in fair market value and usefulness to the lands being alienated or converted.
§ 7. This act shall take effect immediately.
