AN ACT directing the secretary of state to conduct a study on daylight saving time

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Section 1. The secretary of state is authorized and directed to convene a commission consisting of the commissioners of health, education, agriculture and markets, and economic development, or their designees, to conduct a study on the impacts of daylight saving time.

- § 2. Such study shall include, but not be limited to:
 - (a) the history of daylight saving time;
- (b) any relevant studies on daylight saving time;
- 8 (c) the economic impact of keeping and eliminating daylight saving 9 time;
 - (d) health impacts of keeping or eliminating daylight saving time;
- 11 (e) the positions and potential legislation from neighboring states 12 and the federal government on daylight saving time;
 - (f) regulations that are affected by daylight saving time; and
- 14 (g) regulations that would be affected by the elimination of daylight 15 saving time.
- 16 § 3. On or before March 10, 2019, the secretary of state shall report 17 its findings and any recommendations to the governor and the legisla-
- 18 ture. Such report shall include recommendations and such legislative
- 19 proposals as shall be deemed necessary including options for eliminating
- 20 daylight saving time.

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21 § 4. This act shall take effect immediately.
