AN ACT to amend the vehicle and traffic law, in relation to requiring all new motor vehicles sold in this state to be equipped with a blind spot monitoring device

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

1 Section 1. The vehicle and traffic law is amended by adding a new 2 section 379 to read as follows:

- § 379. Blind spot monitoring device. 1. For purposes of this section, the following terms shall have the following meanings:
- a. "blind spot monitoring device" shall mean a system of digital cameras or other media recording devices fitted within the body or on the exterior of a motor vehicle which is capable of monitoring all blind spots associated with such motor vehicle and which generates a warning to the operator of such motor vehicle, by means of a light, a buzzer or both, when any object is detected in such blind spot; and
- b. "blind spot" shall mean an area of the road that cannot be seen by
 the operator of a motor vehicle while looking forward or through either
 the rear-view or side mirrors.
- 2. Commencing with model year two thousand twenty-four and every model
 year thereafter, every automobile sold in this state shall be equipped
 with a blind spot monitoring device. The commissioner is hereby authorized and directed to promulgate rules and regulations necessary for the
- 18 <u>implementation of this section</u>.
- 19 § 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
