AN ACT to amend the public health law, in relation to requiring anaphylactic policies for child care services

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Section 1. The public health law is amended by adding a new section 2500-1 to read as follows:
2500-1 to read as follows:
§ 2500-1. Anaphylactic policy for child care services. 1. For purposes
of this section the term "child care service" shall mean all child day
care centers, as defined in section three hundred ninety of the social
services law, and all public and private nursery schools and pre-kinder-
garten programs.
2. The commissioner shall establish an anaphylactic policy for all
child care services setting forth guidelines and procedures to be
followed for both the prevention of anaphylaxis and during a medical
emergency resulting from anaphylaxis. Such policy shall be developed
after consultation with representatives of pediatric physicians, nurses
and other health care providers with expertise in treating children with
anaphylaxis, parents of children with life threatening allergies, and
appropriate not-for-profit corporations representing allergic individ-
<u>uals at risk for anaphylaxis.</u>
3. The anaphylactic policy established by this section shall include
the following:
(a) a procedure and treatment plan, including responsibilities for
child care service personnel, for responding to anaphylaxis;
(b) a training course for appropriate child care service personnel for
preventing and responding to anaphylaxis;
(c) a procedure and appropriate guidelines for the development of an
individualized emergency health care plan for children with a food or
other allergy which could result in anaphylaxis;
(d) a communication plan for intake and dissemination of information
regarding children with a food or other allergy which could result in
anaphylaxis;

б	about foods that are safe and unsafe for the child, and about strategies

8	4. On or before June thirtieth, two thousand eighteen, an anaphylactic
9	policy shall be jointly forwarded by the commissioner to each child care
10	service in the state. Each child care service shall consider and take
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11 <u>action in response to such anaphylactic policy.</u>
12 § 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
