AN ACT to amend the highway law, in relation to designating a portion of the state highway system as the "PFC David P. Coveny Memorial Highway"

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Section 1. The highway law is amended by adding a new section 344-h to read as follows:
§ 344-h. Portion of the state highway system to be designated as the "PFC David P. Coveny Memorial Highway". All that portion of the state highway system constituting state route nineteen in the county of Wyoming, between Sayre Road and Fox Road, in the towns of Warsaw and Middlebury, shall be designated and known as the "PFC David P. Coveny Memorial Highway".
§ 2. The commissioner of transportation shall provide for the installation and maintenance of adequate signing of the state highway system as designated pursuant to section one of this act. However, to avoid confusion and to limit any possible disruption of commerce, the designation called for pursuant to section one of this act shall be one of ceremonial nature and the official name of such highway shall not be changed as a result of this act.
§ 3. This act shall take effect immediately.
