AN ACT to amend the penal law, in relation to establishing crimes relating to official misconduct for obtaining a benefit

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

- 1 Section 1. Subdivisions 1 and 2 of section 195.00 of the penal law, as 2 amended by chapter 906 of the laws of 1990, are amended to read as 3 follows:
- 1. He <u>or she</u> commits an act relating to his <u>or her</u> office but constituting an unauthorized exercise of his <u>or her</u> official functions, knowing that such act is unauthorized; or
  - 2. He <u>or she</u> knowingly refrains from performing a duty which is imposed upon him <u>or her</u> by law or is clearly inherent in the nature of his <u>or her</u> office.
- 10 § 2. The penal law is amended by adding two new sections 195.03 and 11 195.04 to read as follows:
- 12 <u>§ 195.03 Official misconduct for obtaining a benefit in the second</u>
  13 <u>degree.</u>
- A public servant is guilty of official misconduct for obtaining a
  benefit in the second degree when he or she commits the crime of official misconduct and he or she thereby intentionally obtains any benefit
  for himself or herself or for another person or intentionally deprives
  another person of a benefit, and the value of the benefit exceeds one
- 19 <u>thousand dollars.</u>

A public servant is guilty of official misconduct for obtaining a benefit in the first degree when he or she commits the crime of official misconduct for obtaining a benefit in the second degree, and the value of the benefit exceeds three thousand dollars.

- 5 Official misconduct for obtaining a benefit in the first degree is a 6 class D felony.
- 7 § 3. This act shall take effect on the sixtieth day after it shall 8 have become a law.
