AN ACT to amend the social services law, in relation to requiring the commissioner to prepare a report of the sheltered and unsheltered homeless population during a state disaster emergency

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

- 1 Section 1. Section 17 of the social services law is amended by adding 2 a new subdivision (d-1) to read as follows:
- 3 (d-1)(1) in consultation with each local health department in the
 4 county in which the homeless shelter is located, the commissioner of the
 5 department of health, the commissioners of the department of homeless
- 6 services, and the commissioner of the New York city department of health 7 and mental hygiene, shall collect information regarding the sheltered
- 8 and unsheltered homeless population, during a state disaster emergency,
- 9 as defined in section twenty of the executive law, including but not 10 limited to:
- (i) the number of confirmed infected individuals;
- 12 (ii) the number of hospitalizations;
- 13 (iii) the number of deaths;
- 14 (iv) information regarding the individual, if known; (a) age; (b)
- 15 race; (c) family composition; (d) shelter status; (e) type of shelter
- 16 including: family shelter, a shelter for adults, a hotel, an emergency
- 17 apartment, a domestic violence shelter, a runaway and homeless youth
- 18 shelter, or as a safe house for refugees; (f) any known risk factors;
- 19 and (q) any other information the office deems appropriate.
- 20 (2) utilizing the information collected pursuant to paragraph (1) of
- 21 this subdivision, the commissioners shall publish a report containing
- 22 <u>such information aggregated by county and post it on the website of each</u>
- 23 <u>respective agency.</u>
- 24 § 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
