- AN ACT to amend the election law, in relation to casting and counting absentee ballots without postmarked dates within three days following the day of election

## The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Section 1. Section 8-412 of the election law is amended by adding a new subdivision 3 to read as follows:

3 <u>3. Notwithstanding subdivision one of this section, in the event an</u> 4 <u>absentee ballot is received by mail by the board of elections in an</u> 5 <u>envelope that does not show a postmarked date of the United States</u> 6 <u>postal service, a cancellation mark of the United States postal service</u> 7 <u>or a foreign country's postal service, or a dated endorsement of receipt</u> 8 <u>by another agency of the United States government, and such absentee</u> 9 <u>ballot is received by mail by the board of elections not later than</u> 10 <u>three days following the day of election, such absentee ballot shall be</u> 11 <u>cast and counted.</u>

12 § 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
