AN ACT to amend the public health law, in relation to prohibiting a mandatory immunization against the coronavirus

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Section 1. Article 21 of the public health law is amended by adding a new title 8 to read as follows:

- § 2180. Coronavirus; vaccination. 1. No vaccine used for the purposes of inducing immunity against coronavirus in humans in this state shall be made a mandatory immunization. No person shall be required to receive such vaccine unless such individual chooses to be vaccinated.
- 2. No child under the age of eighteen shall be required to receive such vaccine against coronavirus unless a person in a parental relation to such child chooses to have the child vaccinated. For the purpose of this subdivision the term "person in parental relation to a child" shall mean and include any person who is a parent or legally appointed guardian of a child under the age of eighteen.
- 16 3. No incapacitated person shall be required to receive such vaccine 17 against coronavirus unless a person who is the legal quardian of such incapacitated person chooses to have the incapacitated person vaccinat-18 ed. For the purposes of this subdivision: (a) the term "incapacitated 19 person" shall mean any person over the age of eighteen who are unable to 20 21 make or communicate decisions affecting their physical health, safety, 22 or self-care; and (b) the term "legal guardian" shall mean and include 23 any person who is over the age of eighteen and designated by an incapac-24 itated person prior to incapacitation as their legal guardian or a person legally appointed by a court as quardian of such incapacitated 25 26 person.
- 27 § 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
