AN ACT to amend the navigation law, in relation to requiring individuals renting a boat to take a boating safety course

## The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Section 1. Subdivisions 1 and 1-a of section 71-d of the navigation 1 2 law, subdivision 1 as added by chapter 698 of the laws of 1971 and 3 subdivision 1-a as added by chapter 361 of the laws of 2013, are amended 4 to read as follows: 5 1. No livery operator shall knowingly lease, hire or rent a vessel to б any person: 7 (a) When the number of persons using the vessel shall exceed the 8 number deemed to constitute a maximum safety load for said vessel, 9 according to its capacity plate or industry-accepted standards. 10 (b) When the manufacturer's rated horsepower of the motor exceeds the 11 capacity of the vessel, making the vessel unsafe to operate. (c) When the vessel does not contain the equipment required by its 12 13 respective class, as provided by section forty. 14 (d) When such person is not the holder of a boating safety certif-15 <u>icate.</u> [1-a. Notwithstanding subdivision one of section forty-nine of this 16 17 article, a livery may lease, hire or rent a mechanically propelled 18 vessel, except a personal water craft or specialty prop craft, to a person who is not the holder of a boating safety certificate if: 19 20 (a) the person is eighteen years or older; 21 (b) the operator of such livery or his or her designated agent, is the 22 holder of a boating safety certificate, and prior to permitting the use 23 by such person of the vessel explains and demonstrates to such person by 24 video or actual in water demonstration the operation of such vessel, and 25 the use and location of such vessel's safety equipment;

14 have become a law. Effective immediately the addition, amendment and/or 15 repeal of any rule or regulation necessary for the implementation of 16 this act on its effective date is authorized to be made and completed on 17 or before such date.
