AN ACT to amend the public health law, in relation to the provision of informed consent

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

T	Section 1. Paragraph (g) of subdivision 1 of section 2803 of the
2	public health law, as added by chapter 2 of the laws of 1988, is amended

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(vi) a right to a discharge review in accordance with section twenty-1 2 eight hundred three-i of this article. The form and content of such statement shall be determined in accordance with rules and regulations 3 4 adopted by the council and approved by the commissioner. A patient who 5 requires continuing health care services in accordance with such б patient's discharge plan may not be discharged until such services are 7 secured or determined by the hospital to be reasonably available to the patient. Each general hospital shall give a copy of the statement to 8 9 each patient, or the appointed personal representative of the patient at 10 or prior to the time of admission to the general hospital, as long as 11 the patient or the appointed personal representative of the patient 12 receives such notice no earlier than fourteen days before admission. 13 Such statement shall also be conspicuously posted by the hospital and shall be a part of the patient's admission package. Nothing herein 14 15 contained shall be construed to limit any authority vested in the 16 commissioner pursuant to this article related to the operation of hospi-17 tals and care and services provided to patients.

18 § 2. This act shall take effect on the first of January next succeed-19 ing the date on which it shall have become a law; provided, however, 20 that effective immediately, the addition, amendment and/or repeal of any 21 rule or regulation necessary for the implementation of this act on its 22 effective date are authorized and directed to be made and completed on 23 or before such effective date.
